Atom Clippers off to winning start

The Stouffville Fame International Atom Clippers are undefeated after their first three league games this season.

The Atoms opened the Ontario Minor Hockey Association (OMHA) season last week in Bowmanville, fighting their way to a

4-4 tie against very tough opposition.

Bowmanville got off to a fast start and jumped to a 2-0 lead before the Clippers found their legs in the second period.

Geoff Smith and Brent Avery scored in the second frame to bring the Atoms even, and John

McKinnon put them ahead 3-2 late in the period.

Roger McMann and Jason Reesor earned assists on the go-ahead goal which McKinnon flipped high over the fallen Bowmanville goalie.

The Clippers took a two-goal lead just into the final period when Jason Davis banged one home. Assists on the goal went to Ryan Burkholder and Phil Pridham.

However, the Stouffville boys couldn't hold the strong Bowmanville squad back and the match ended in a tie.

Throughout the contest, defencemen Brian Coughlan, Chad Dickinson, Sian Morrison, David Mountjoy and Jason Reesor performed solidly, as did goalie Greg Sanford.

The Atoms hosted Coburg for their home opener last week, and great play by the penalty killers led to a 3-2 Stouffville win.

Once again, the Atoms fell behind early by two goals but this time when they fought back to take the lead, they kept it.

Roger McMann started the comeback with a nice goal on a set up from Ryan Jefferson and John McKinnon.

Lindsay Haylow's short handed goal brought the Clippers even, thanks to an outstanding bit of puck control by Jason Reesor. Sian Morrison also collected an assist on the play.

Ryan Burkholder scored the winner, also in a short-handed situation, when he picked off a bad pass at the blueline and took it in alone on the surprised Coburg goalie.

Though he got off to a rough start, between the pipes, goalie Brad Hackert made some big saves to preserve the win.

They improved their record to one win and two ties when they beat Lindsay 5-4 on Sunday.

Geoff Smith's goal in the dying seconds of the first period evened the score at the intermission.

This was a tight game with the scoring going back and forth until Stouffville broke open the 3-3 tie in the third with a pair of goals.

Roger McMann broke the tie on set up from Geoff Smith, then Brent Avery tucked in a rebound of Smith blast from the point to put Stouffville up by two.

Lindsay made it close with another goal, but Brad Hackert's strong play foiled the oppositions attempts to tie.

Stouffville's other two goals went to Phil Pridham, on assists from Ryan Burkholder, Roger McMann and Lindsay Haylow.

This Friday night, the Atom Clippers host Lindsay in a rematch at the Recreation Centre. Game time is 8 p.m.
