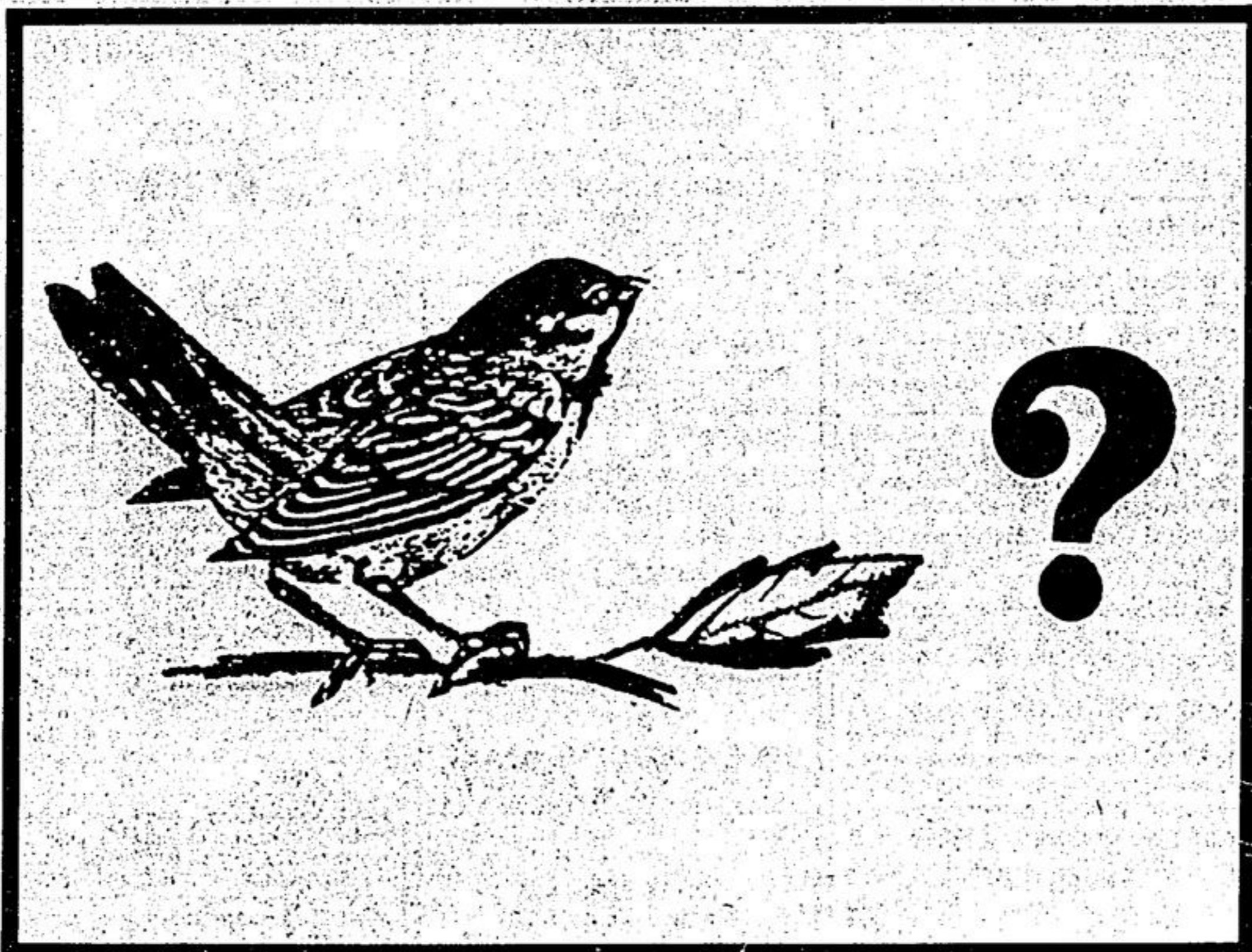
The annual meeting of the Whitechurch-Stouffville Community Ball Association will be Thursday, Nov. 12 at the Recreation Centre.

Tickets will be on sale till Nov. 14, and can be obtained from B. Menar at 640-4522 or D. Forsyth at 640-5463.

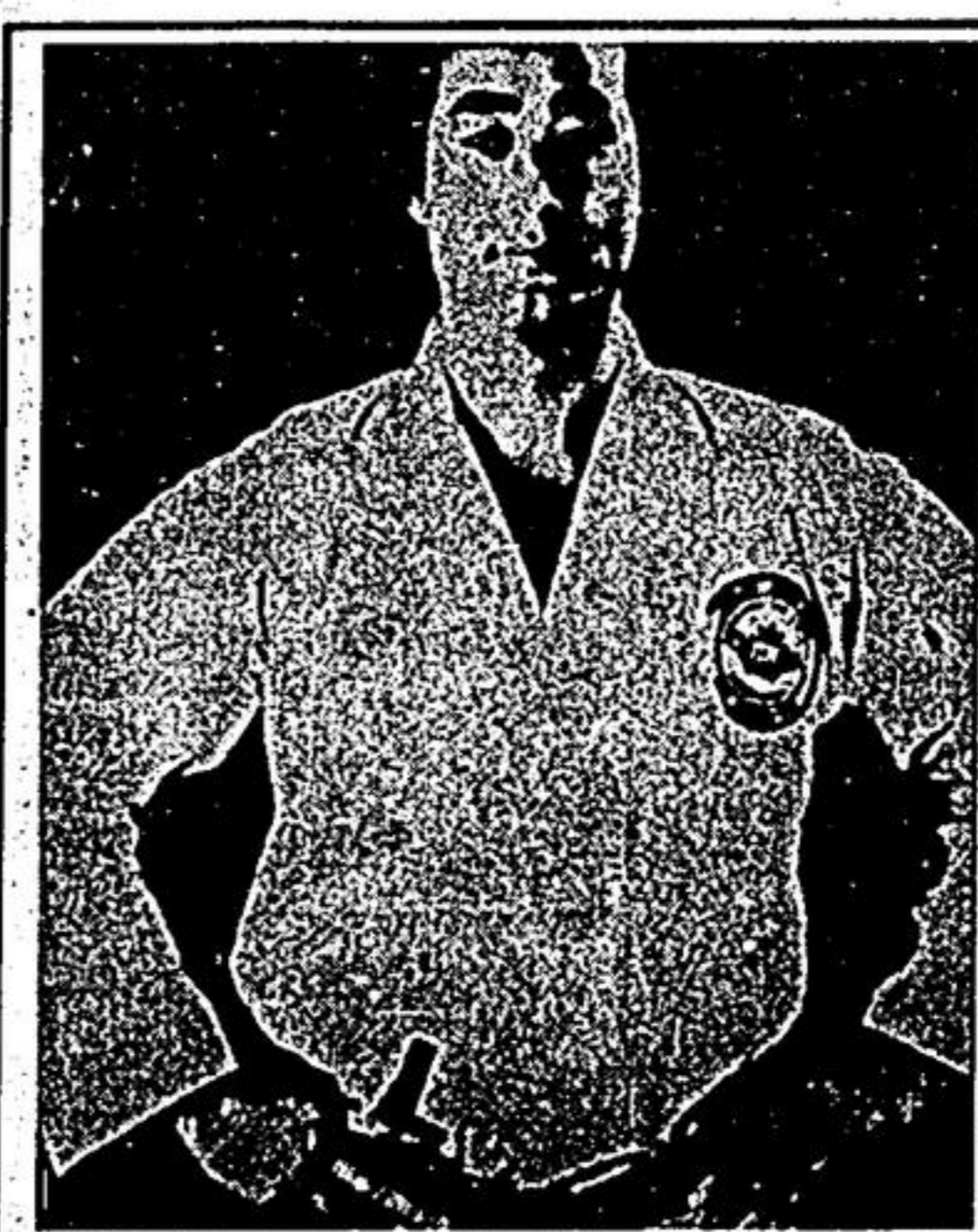
