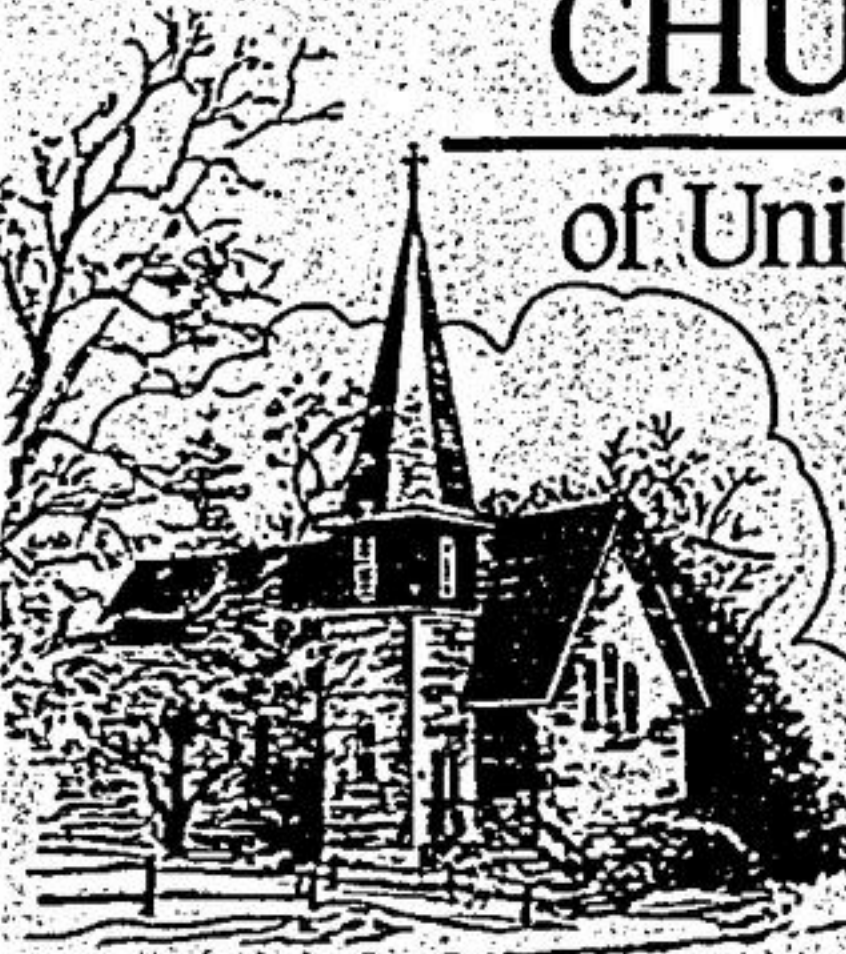

Last year the clothing manufacturing industry spent \$5,740,000,000. Canadians spent about \$10,000,000,000 on clothes. Canadians spend on the average 5-10% of their salary on clothes. The clothing industry (excluding retail) employs at least twice as many people as any other sector of Canadian industry. These statistics suggest to us that Canadian culture puts a high priority on clothing. We are not to be conformed to this world's way of thinking (Rom. 12:2) or be polluted by the world (James 1:27). On the positive side we are to do everything to the glory of God (1 Cor. 10:31) and do everything in the name of Christ (Col. 3:17). How does one then view this area of creation in a godly manner? What is the Biblical view? Christians need to strain contemporary apparel practices through? If Christian consumers are to glorify God in their buying and practice of dressing themselves what direction does God give them? If people employed in one way or another in the clothing business want to glorify God and serve their fellow man in their work, what perspective does God give? Just before God sent Adam and Eve from the garden He made garments for them and clothed them. Was this the result of sin? Would the world have been one big nudist colony if Adam and Eve had remained faithful to God? What was the significance of Moses using precious small space to record this activity of God? Does it have any significance for the way Christians are to image and glorify God in this area of creation? Genesis 3:20,21 will occupy our attention this Sunday morning at 11:00 a.m.

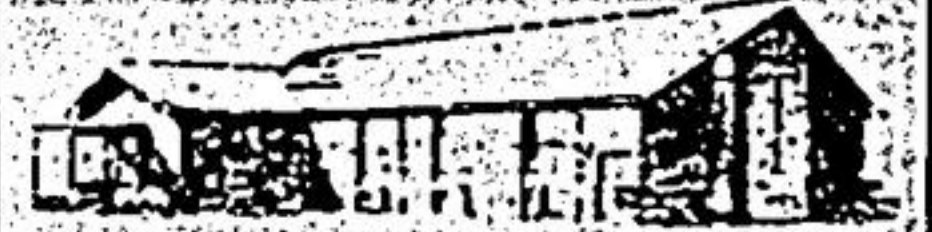

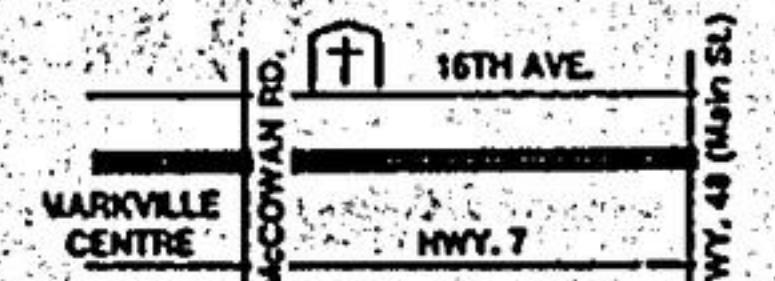
