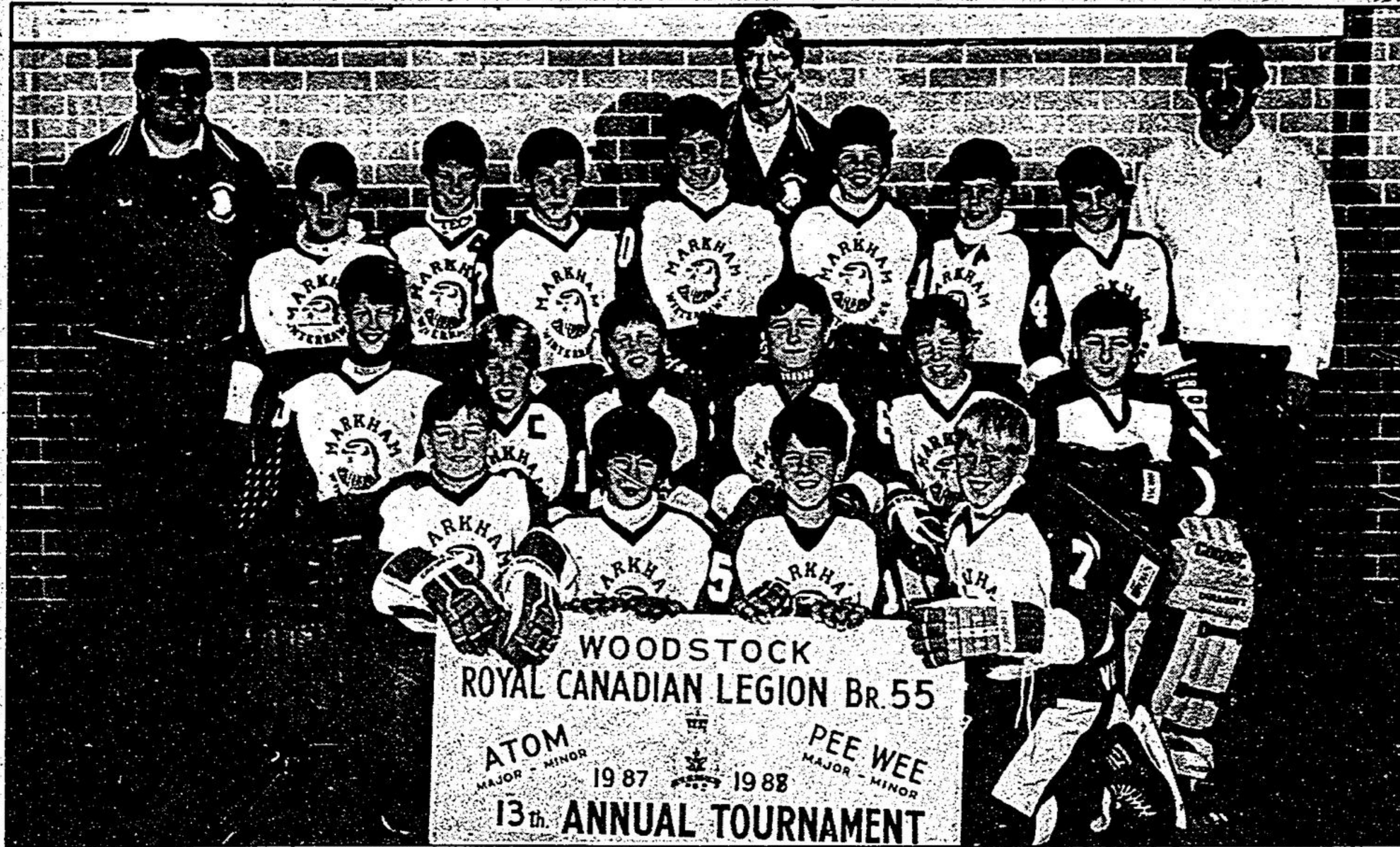

# Unbeaten year for Stouffville

Perfect.  
It's the only word to describe the Stouffville District Secondary School (SDSS) Midget girls basketball team's 12-0 season.  
The Midgets capped off the perfect season Tuesday afternoon with an 18-17 win over Aurora at SDSS to end league play.  
Long-time SDSS staff members can't ever remember a girls basketball team with a perfect record, and Phys Ed Department Head Dave Connell ventured to say it was the first time in the school's history.  
The pressure on the girls to make SDSS sports history intensi-

fied with every win, and the hype for Tuesday's final game was huge.  
Midget coach Bill McKnight said the pressure got to both teams, and the game was a sloppy affair. Julie Coleman's eight-point performance was notable, though.  
"The girls were really tense going in," said McKnight. "Both teams were nervous, and it showed in the play. It wasn't a very good game. We managed to hold on, but didn't play as well as we can."  
Now that all the hoopla is over, McKnight said the team can concentrate on today's York Region championship tournament at Holy Trinity in Richmond Hill.  
There are six teams at the competition — the top two from the North, South-east and South-west divisions. They'll be split into two sections with the winners meeting in the final.  
While a lot of the credit for the Midget Spartans success must go to coaches McKnight and Doug Walker, the excellent coaching staffs at Stouffville-area elementary schools can also share some of the glory.  
Since most of the players are in Grade Nine, this was their first season of high school basketball, but McKnight said they had obviously been well coached before SDSS.  
"Most of the girls were just out of the elementary system and I'd have to give a lot of credit to the coaches at Ballantrae Public School in particular," he said.  
For McKnight, a first-year electronics teacher at SDSS, this was also his first season of coaching basketball. But he's also coaching minor hockey, and softball in Stouffville.

However, the key to the team's success ultimately goes to the players, McKnight said.  
"The girls have worked very hard this year. We have good talent on this team, and without that everything else is meaningless."
