Initially, Armin managed The Muscle Factory at 60 Esna Park Drive, Markham. Later, he opened and operated The Iron-

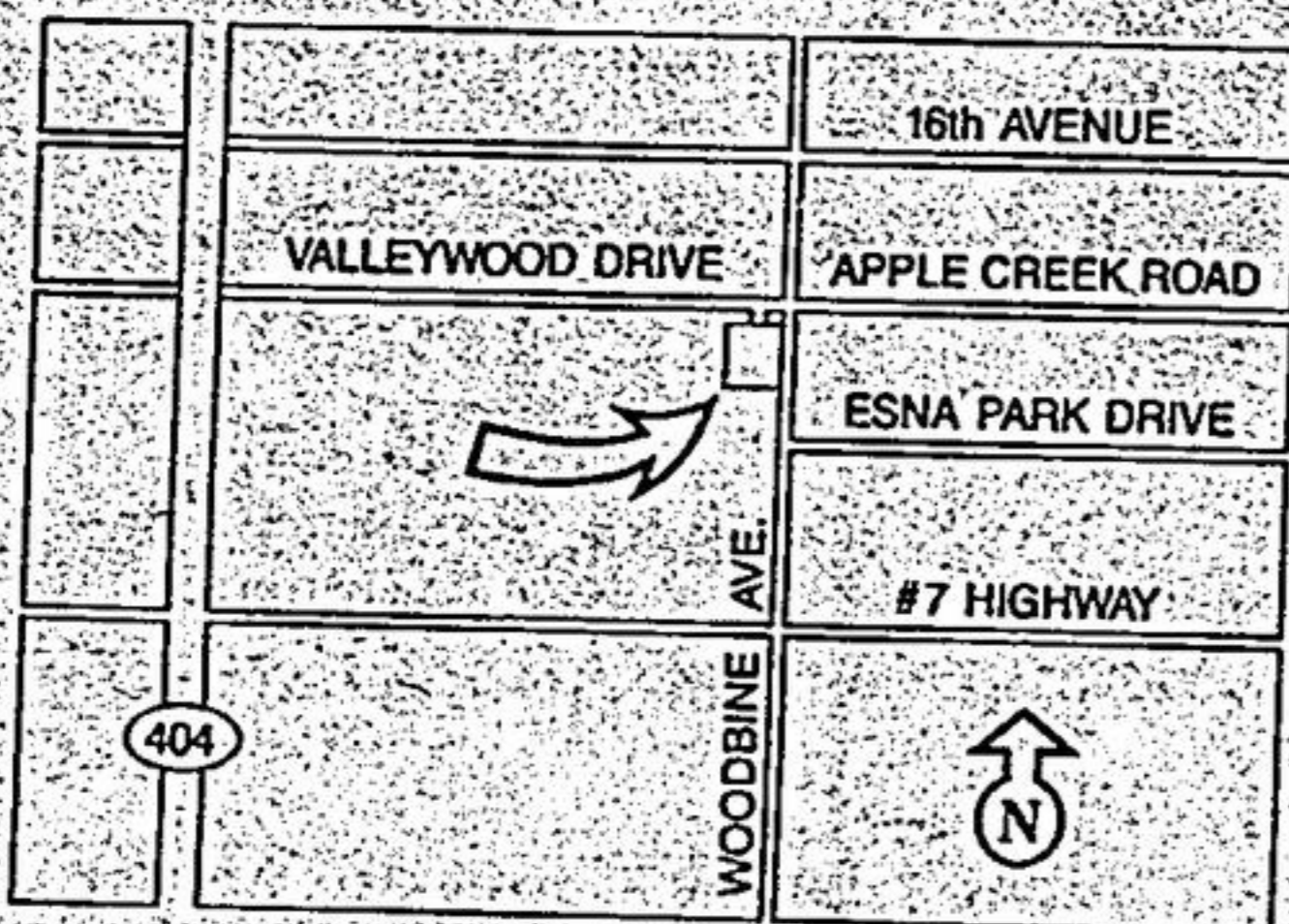
works on Bullock Drive, Markham.
