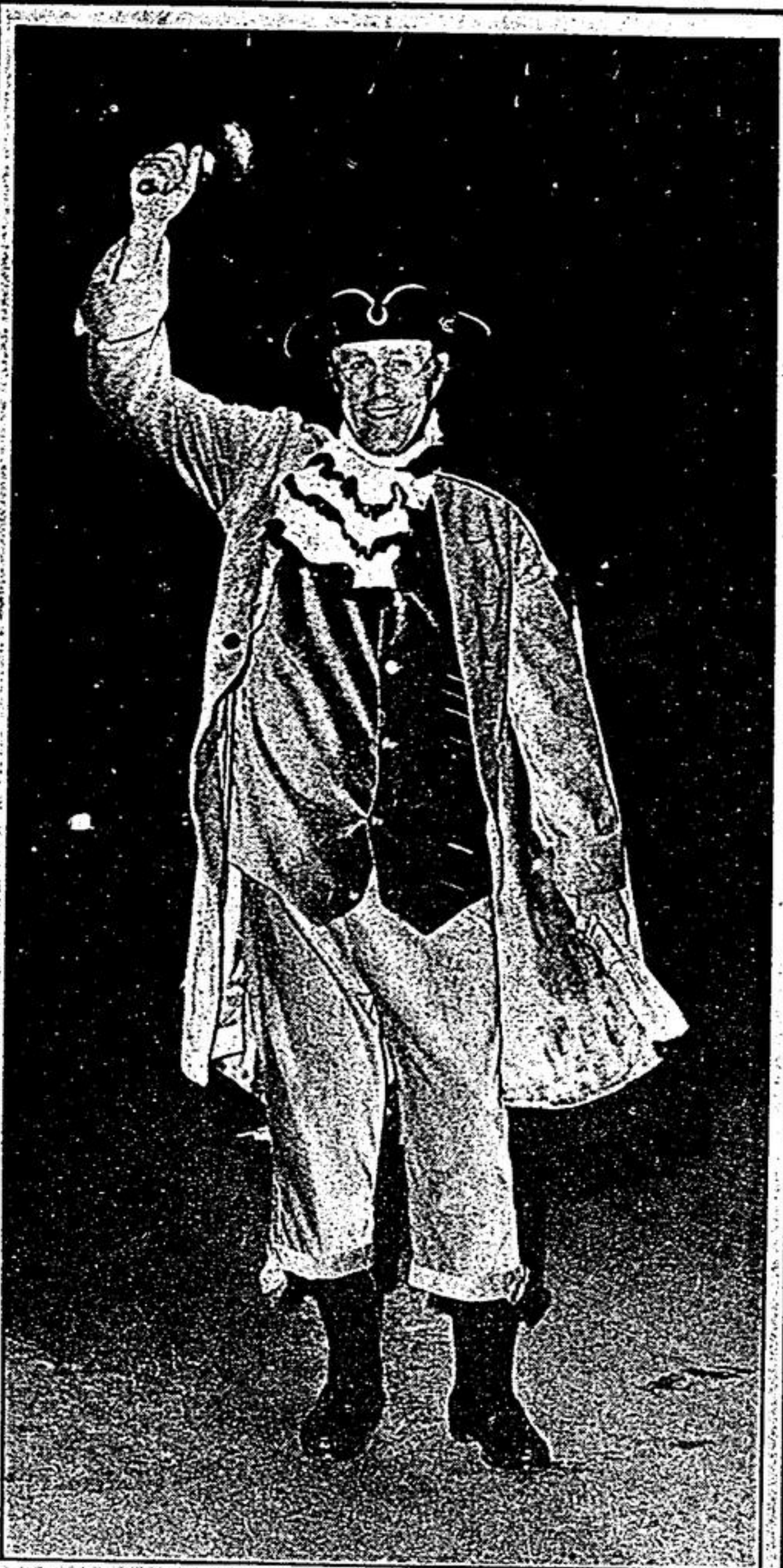

Cemetery search is underway

STOUFFVILLE — Is there someone buried in your backyard? Has the name on the grave marker been obliterated by time? If so, the Toronto Branch of the Ontario Genealogical Society wants to know. This organization is presently compiling an inventory of all burying places and family cairns in York Region. Purpose is to improve access to the valuable historical information they contain. "Many of our forebearers are interred in long-forgotten plots set aside by pioneer families or communities," says Society member Shirley Lancaster. "These are clues to descendants searching for their roots. Some stones even list the dates families arrived in Canada and birthplaces in their homelands. Often, this is the only place such information is recorded." "Do you know the locations of cemeteries that should be listed?" asks Shirley. "Have you heard stories of any that may exist?" "Do you know where any burial records are stored?" If so, she'd appreciate a call. The contact number is 889-0498. The address of the Ontario Genealogical Society, (Toronto Branch), is Box 147, Station 'Z', Toronto, (M5N 1Z3). "Help us compile a complete inventory," Shirley concludes.
