### The Planning Act and The Parkway Belt Planning and Development Act

Town of Markham

Take notice that a request for exemption from the Parkway Belt Land Use Regulation filed as Ontario Regulation 473/73 in the Town of Markham has been received.

Applicant: The Town of Markham  
File No.: 19-20-032-87006

Proposal: The Town of Markham has requested a site specific exemption from the Parkway Belt Land Use regulations to permit Bylaw 423-87 to come into force and effect. This by-law will permit the development of storm water detention facilities and a future industrial development on lands that are outside of the design requirements for Highway 407. The lands are located in Lot 8, Concession 4, east of Woodbine Avenue, north of the proposed Highway 407 boundary, at the proposed crossing of the Highway by Rodick Road.

All submissions received in the office of the Minister of Municipal Affairs, c/o Plans Administration Branch, Central and Southwest, 14th floor, 777 Bay Street, Toronto, Ontario M5G 2E5, on or before the 4th day of February, 1988, dealing with this application will be considered before a final decision is made.

Under Section 46(10) of the Planning Act, any interested party may request a hearing by the Ontario Municipal Board on an application for amendment to the Land Use Regulation.
