With time running out, John Blair sent "Round" McKinnon in alone and he drilled a hard shot over the Kingston goalie's shoulder for a 3-2 tie. Gary Williams made a superb glove save in the dying seconds to preserve the tie.

The Amherst Alers, who already had two wins, were the Clippers' Sunday morning foes. This was the Betz Poolers' best game, and they outplayed and outscored the Alers 4-1. Goals were by Ellis, Blair, McMann and Upton.

However, the Clippers should have saved that game for the 2 p.m. Championship match against the Amherst team. Ralph "Bugsy" Cain was the only Clipper to score on a strong goaltender, and the Alers scored four goals before that.

A comeback looked possible, but superb saves by the Amherst goalie against Upton, Corner, and Ron Cain led to the Clippers' downfall, 4-1.
