Plan conservation area

Mr. Angus Morton has been elected as Chairman of the Lake Simcoe Region Conservation Authority along with Mr. Allan Glassford as Vice-chairman for 1988. Both were acclaimed for the

third consecutive term at the Conservation Authority's 37th Inaugural Meeting on February 18th. The Inaugural Meeting is held annually to elect officials from among the 26 members that make

up the authority. The membership is comprised of representatives of the provincial government and the 18 member municipalities within the Lake Simcoe watershed. Mr. Morton is a representative for the Town of East Gwillimbury while Reeve Allan Glassford is a representative for the Township of Tecumseth.

Also elected was Councillor David Marquis (Township of Brock) as chairman of the Authority's Conservation and Community Relations Advisory Board. Councillor Francis Reid (Township of West Gwillimbury) was acclaimed as the new chairman of the Authority's Water Management Advisory Board after being nominated by the board's past chairman Reeve Grant Andrade (Township of Innisfil). The five members elected to the Authority's Executive Committee were: Reeve Grant Andrade (Township of Innisfil), Reeve Sandy Hudson (Town of Bradford), Councillor E.I. Lyons (Town of Georgina), Mr. G.R. Richardson (Town of Newmarket), Mrs. Susan Shaw (Town of Aurora).

Invited as guest speaker was Mr. Charles Sauriol, formerly an Environmental Consultant with the Nature Conservancy of Canada and now working with the Institute of Marine and Terrestrial Ecology. Mr. Sauriol has been instrumental in raising \$240,000 from private donors for the Lake Simcoe Region Conservation Authority towards the purchase price of an area known as the McLennan property. The 97 hectare site located in the Town of Whitechurch-Stouffville, was purchased by the Conservation Authority at a cost of \$640,000 in 1986. The Authority plans to eventually develop the area as a conservation area. At the meeting, Chairman Angus Morton presented Mr. Sauriol with a framed photo and plaque of the McLennan Property in recognition of his dedication towards the acquisition of this property.

Guilty plea to sexual assault

A Whitechurch-Stouffville man has pleaded guilty to two counts of sexual assault involving 13-year-old girls. His plea was entered in at Newmarket District Court on Monday.

Richard Alfred Chase, who lives at Zweibrucken Horse Farm, admitted to sexually assaulting the girls during similar but separate incidents — one on January 1984 and the other on August 1986.

Both of the girls kept their horses at Chase's Stables.

In both cases, Chase would ask the girls to spend the night at the stable to prepare for a horse show the next day.

He would then tell them to lay down on the couch, so he could give a relaxing massage, crown attorney J. Sandy Tse, said in court. Chase would then fondle the girls.

Chase will return to court for sentencing on June 17.
