The late Mr. Ellis never lost his love for children, an enjoyment that endeared himself to young people wherever he worked. He was an avid photographer and often took pictures of various activities involving the boys and girls and their teachers.

Besides his wife, Mr. Ellis is survived by his father, a son Richard; a daughter Patricia; one brother, Ernie and a sister, Shirley; (Mrs. John Long), both of Aurora.

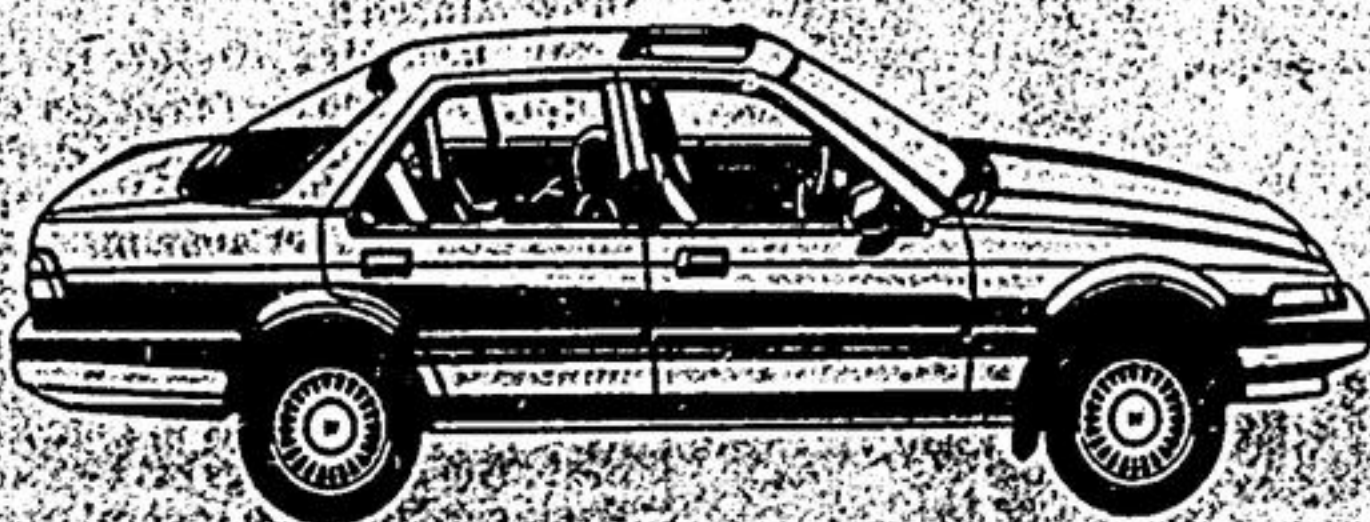
