Ice life suits Stephanie fine

 Like mother, like daughter. In the case of Stouffville's Stephanie Barclay, one of the Stouffville Figure Skating Club's most accomplished performers, she's simply following in the footsteps of her mother.
 "Mom's been skating all her life," says Stephanie about her mother Jean, who is currently in charge of teaching the local club's pre-schoolers. "And I got started when I was about three or four-years-old."
 The fast and aggressive Stephanie, now 17, has developed a disciplined approach to her skating through the years and it has paid dividends in terms of personal achievements and competitive results.

She is also a prefect at the school and has choreographed the dance routines for this year's Variety Show.
 Besides that she manages to find time to work at 'The Wedding Room', a Main Street business operated by her mother.
 "I try to do things other than skating," she maintains.
 Her big outside interest this year involves her trip to Heilbronn, West Germany, as part of the SDSS student exchange program.
 She will be staying at the house of a German student who made a similar journey to Stouffville, staying with Stephanie this past September through December. Stephanie plans to be overseas until June 23.

At the moment she is working on her 6th Figure, on her Silver Freestyle and on her Gold Level in Dance.
 In 1985, her best year from a competitive standpoint, she had a first at the Upper York Interclub Competition in the Interpretive category and placed second overall out of more than 30 skaters in the Uxbridge Competition.
 In addition she has placed near the top in a competition held in North Bay featuring skaters from all across the province.
 "Every competition I have entered, I've won something," she recalls.
 The current season has seen her up at the top of the Stouffville Club with a second place finish at the Upper York competition which pits skaters against the best from Richmond Hill, Aurora, Newmarket, Markham and Stouffville.
 Her dedication has led to training as many as 15 hours-a-week in the pursuit of skating excellence.
 "I stuck it out after lots of my friends quit," she says. "It is a lot of work."

The unique opportunity will see her going to Austria to ski and she is scheduled to visit Berlin, Bonn, Paris and perhaps Rome.
 Preparation for the trip have resulted in cramming her entire school year into less than seven months.
 "I have to have everything finished here before I go over there," she says.
 One area of her life that has suffered a little because of the expedition is her skating.
 "I've had to cut it back this year," she admits. "And I'm going to have to miss the carnival this year. I miss the carnival because it's always so much fun after all the competitions."
 Stephanie will leave her skates behind when she makes the trip to Germany.
 "It will be the longest time I have been off skates in years," she claims. But she will pick up her routine again in the fall and work towards her skating goals.
 "I skate for my own sense of accomplishment," she insists. "Winning is good, but you have to enjoy just going out there. When I stop enjoying it I'll quit."

Stephanie credits good coaching for much of her ability.
 "I have Jack Belec from Unionville as my freestyle and figures coach and Danny Sorley for dance," she says. "Jack has been my coach for about five years now. It is really nice when you can keep a coach for a long time."
 When speaking of her mother's role in Stephanie's skating career, she is quick to point out she has always followed her own lead.
 "Mom never pushed me. For a while, I'd discourage her from watching me because she would see flaws others wouldn't," Stephanie admits. "It made me nervous; but that's not a problem now. She really encourages me."
 With so much time spent on the ice, Stephanie claims the arena starts to become a vital part of her social life.
 "The competition is keen, but you develop friendly rivalries and meet a lot of friends," she adds. "You're competing against the same people year after year."
 But dreams of a professional skating career are far from her mind.
 "I don't think I'd like to pursue it as a career," Stephanie says. "But I'll probably be a coach, I like the kids. I've taught group lessons for Mom sometimes."
 And she does have other interests. She has taught swimming at the town pool for the past two years, is treasurer of the Student Council at Stouffville Dist. Secondary School where she is a Grade 12 student.
