### Fast food contents unknown

STOUFFVILLE — Should all the ingredients that go into the making of a McDonald's hamburger or a Harvey's milkshake be identified?

Councillor Jim Sanders says yes.

Councillor Wilf Morley replies no.

The debate occurred March 25 in response to a resolution from the City of Chatham that read in part:

"That the Hon. Jake Epp, Minister of National Health and Welfare be petitioned to use his good offices to convince his colleagues in caucus that legislation should be enacted requiring all food sold in fast-food outlets, restaurants and catering services contain labels listing all ingredients contained in the food being offered for sale."

Councillor Morley said such disclosures could raise food prices "and cause a hardship to families whose only treat is a hamburger at McDonald's."

Councillor Sanders argued that patrons with allergies could consume certain foods without knowing the ingredients and die.

Councillor Margot Marshall said she'd seen the issue discussed on CBC television and while undoubtedly worthwhile, the cost could be excessive.
