## New Clusters on hold for Town approval

Dear Editor:  
Thank you for your reporting of the Parkview Cluster Home project in the Tribune's April 6 issue. We're grateful for your personal interest and support of Parkview.

I'd like to clarify a few points mentioned in the April 6 article.  
(1) It is true, as you said, our long-term projections include plans for an additional twenty Cluster Home units. These plans, however, are on hold until the necessary sewer and water capacity allocations are available from the Municipality.

(2) The 'Application to the Town' to which you referred is a request for the necessary allocations as referred to above. To date no response has been received from the Municipality to this request.

In our application, Parkview is in an excellent position to increase the supply of 'affordable housing' in this community. We have the land, the necessary zoning, and a functioning non-profit organization.

Currently, we operate 'affordable housing' units in the context of two definitions of this term.

(a) The Parkview Village Apartments where persons with limited incomes may have their

rent subsidized under the Rent-Geared-To-Income program of the Ontario Community Housing Assistance Program.

(b) The Parkview Village Cluster Homes where the price of the 'Right to Occupy' agreement is in the 'affordable' category when compared with similar accommodation in the community.

Parkview is ready to work with the Municipality and the community in providing more 'affordable' housing when and if the Municipality approves the necessary sewer and water allocations.
