CLAREMONT — The Claremont United Church will present a special instrumental musical program Sunday, April 17 as part of the 11:15 a.m. service.

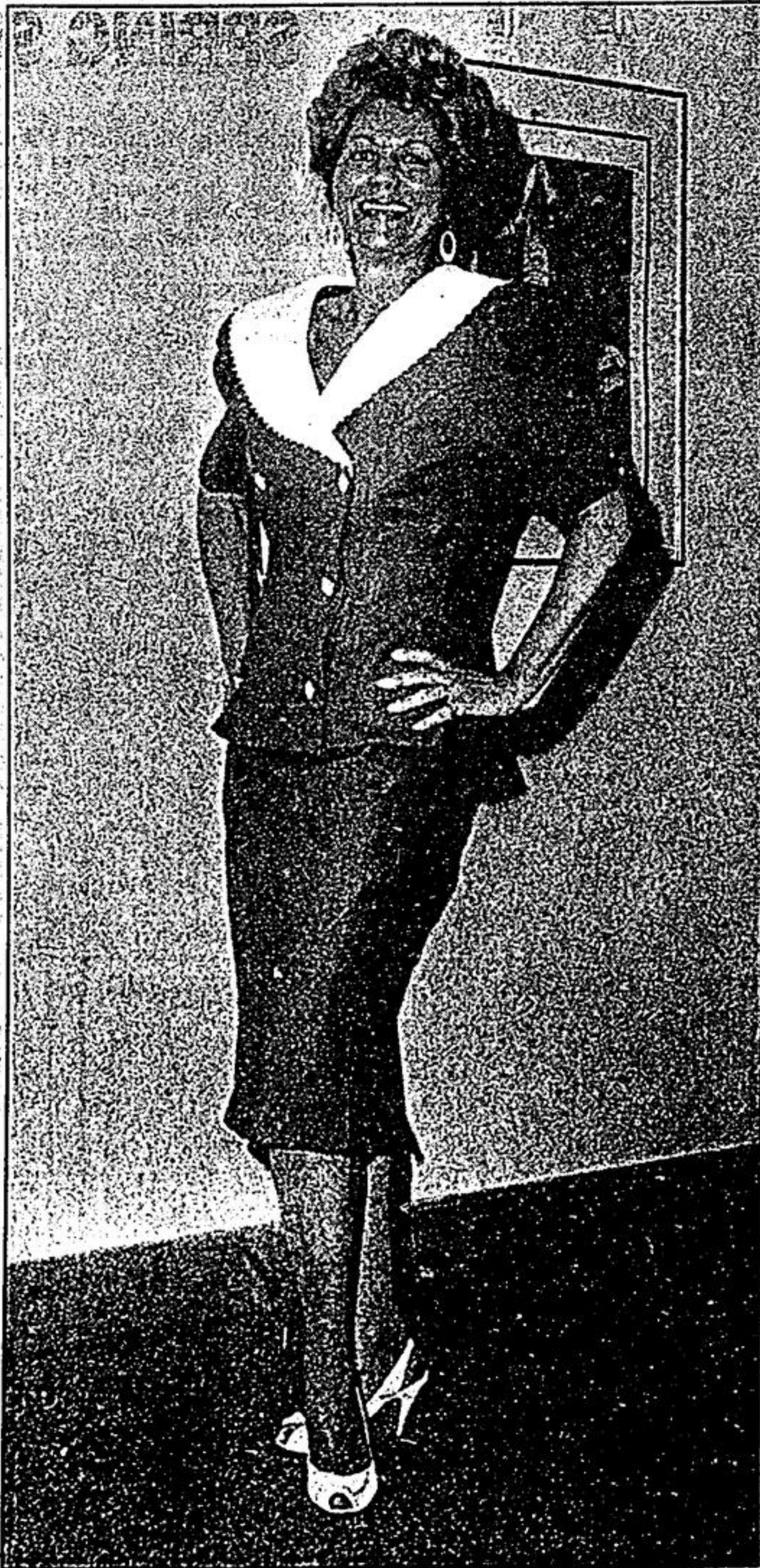
