"That was our one night out," Grace claims. "We didn't have much money but we sure had fun."

The two were never content to just sit back and watch without getting involved in some pretty serious cheering.

"They were the greatest boosters the Millionaires ever had," maintains Ken Brennan, a team mate of George and Fred. "But they were always on you to get going."

"I remember more than once when I'd be skating up the ice and I'd hear one of them yell out

Like a seventh player for the M's, the Scott girls weren't above their own "intimidation" tactics that had the opposition looking over their shoulder.

"I guess I shouldn't really say this," Mary laughs. "But I remember the time at a playoff game at Oshawa that Grace hit the other team's goalie over the head with her purse between periods — and she didn't even get a penalty!"

Brennan chuckles, "You didn't want to get too close to the boards if you played for the other team with those two around."

Grace and Mary prefer to see themselves as fun loving, if enthusiastic fans, who always enjoyed the excitement and fellowship provided by the Millionaires' games.

"Most of the wives came to the games," Mary says. "We were part of a good sized group of faithful fans."

She recalls how the women would assemble around the pot bellied stove at intermission. The arenas back then were natural ice with a shelter built around them, making for some cold nights in January.

"But the cold never bothered us," Grace insists.

Both women were delighted that this year's reunion had been opened up to the wives, unlike last year's.
