Flying high for charity

The First Canadian chapter a women pilots organization will touch down in Markham this month.

The Ninety-Nines Inc., a non-profit, international organization of women pilots, is hosting a Poker Run on Saturday, May 28.

The purpose of the Poker Run is to encourage participation in aviation for fun and recreation with friends and other pilots.

Any profits from the Poker Run go toward aviation related scholarships, awards, museums, or other charities.

The Run is open to all pilots and their passengers. Participants

will have their choice of five out of 10 airports to fly to.

At the first airport, entry forms designed to accommodate one poker hand can be purchased. Each entry form is \$4 (or five for \$15).

Pilots and passengers are encouraged to purchase several hands.

At each airport, one card is attached to each form until the hand is complete. The last stop must be Guelph Airpark where the best hand will be determined by judges and the prizes will be awarded.

The participating airports are: Collingwood, Brampton, Barrie, Markham, Lindsay, Orillia, Peterborough, Brantford, Burlington and Guelph.

All airports will be staffed by 99's beginning at 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. Arrival at Guelph must be by 3 p.m. A barbecue will begin at noon and the prizes will be awarded at 4 p.m.
