Climbs ladder

STOUFFVILLE — Peter Hiscott, Stuart Street, Stouffville, has been appointed Superintendent of Programs (French) by York-Region Board of Education, effective Sept. 1, 1988. Mr. Hiscott has been associated with York Region Board for 20 years.

"I started out teaching French and Physical Education, joining the staff at Sutton High School as vice-principal in the mid-1970s," he recalls. Mr. Hiscott was later promoted to the position of principal at Sutton where he remained until 1986.

Two years ago, he joined the Board office as Assistant Supervisor of Human Resources with special responsibilities for French Immersion.

"It's a treat to see the progress made by these children," he says. "It's amazing to listen to Grade 3 students so fluent in French."

Mr. Hiscott claims he had wanted to teach as long as he can remember.

"I still enjoy it and am very excited to be involved with French Immersion," he states.

Extension of the program to the secondary level is being planned and although Grade 7 classes are currently small, "they're getting larger each year with the younger pupils coming on," he explains.

NOTICE OF MEETING
The Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville will hold a public meeting on TUESDAY, JUNE 21st, 1988 at 8:00 P.M. in LATCHAM HALL located at 32 PARK DRIVE SOUTH, STOUFFVILLE, ONTARIO, to make available adequate information to the public regarding, and to consider, a proposed Official Plan Amendment to be passed pursuant to Section 17 of the Planning Act.

SUBJECT PROPERTY
The subject property is shown outlined as the Gormley 404 Industrial Secondary Plan.

EXPLANATORY NOTE
The proposed Amendment, being the Gormley 404 Industrial Secondary Plan, would generally change the land use designations in the Official Plan from Rural to Industrial. Other appropriate changes in the land use designations will be made in accordance with the Secondary Plan.

The proposed Amendment, as shown on the plan, comprises approximately 650 acres (263 hectares). The proposed Amendment will include appropriate land use policies to govern and control development within the Secondary Plan area.

REPRESENTATION
ANY PERSON may attend the public meeting and make written or oral representation either in support of or in opposition to the proposed Amendment. If you are unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the meeting. Written submissions should include a request for further notification, if so desired.
