

Sisters cook up family memories at SDSS caf

Catering in the Stouffville District Secondary School cafeteria is a truly family affair. Sisters Catherine McArthur, Doris Williams and Linda Hilt, who are employed by Eastwood Food Services, work full time to provide the choices which would satisfy the pickiest eater.

"We have another sister, Donna Becket, and she fills in when we need her," explains Catherine.

It all started when Doris answered an ad in the paper in September, 1968. She got the job. When someone else in the kitchen left temporarily in February, 1969, Catherine agreed to help out. "Doris asked if I could fill in for a

while. The person who left couldn't come back and I'm still here."

Linda, who had been working part time with her sisters, took on a full time position in September last year.

The cafeteria opens at 8:30 a.m. "We provide a variety of cooked breakfasts," says Catherine. "I arrive between 7:30 and 8 a.m. and we're open from 8:30 to 11 and again from 11:40 to 12:40."

The lunch menu is extensive and includes items such as quiche ("we make it ourselves"), fish and chips, jumbo hot dogs, burgers of all kinds and different types of salads.

They also provide home made

soups ("the kids love that") and five or six different kinds of sandwiches. The sisters have developed a good rapport with the students, "most of the kids are polite and pleasant," states Catherine, "sometimes they will drop by for a chat."

Being part of the staff, the sisters like to be involved in school activities, "We usually dress up for Halloween," Catherine says.

To complete the family feeling in the kitchen the sisters' mother, Margaret Hilt, worked there in the early '70s. Catherine can't imagine working anywhere else, "the hours are good, we like the kids and we don't have to work during school holidays."
