The Stouffville Stingers rolled to a 10-7 victory over Mt. Albert Thursday in a wild and woolly affair.
But the victory wasn't assured until rightfielder Lisa Blanchard made a sensational running catch of a foul ball in the seventh.
Mt. Albert carried a 4-1 lead into the bottom of the third inning, but the home squad engineered an attack that saw four runs cross the plate before the inning was through.

Singles by Allison Ashton, Sheila Fockler and Candy Brown were followed by Debbie Gold's two-run triple and a run-producing double by Allison Lowery.

The Stingers added two more in the fourth when winning pitcher Candy Brown doubled home Fockler and catcher Gold drove in Brown with a single.

They came up with another pair in the fifth when Cathy Carr cashed Cathy Shore with a

sacrifice fly, and Diana Buchanan sent Denise Davies home with a base hit. Davies then singled home Lowery to close out the Stingers' scoring in the sixth.

Meanwhile, Mt. Albert was making it close by adding a run in the fifth, and two in the sixth to give the home crowd fits.

Brown, while not spectacular on the mound for the Stingers, was more than adequate as she struck out five.

The Stingers lost earlier in the week, 10-1 in Bradford.

Betz trounces Oshawa in 7-2 fastball pitching duel

The Betz Pools Fastball team upped their record to 4-2 with a decisive 7-2 victory over the Oshawa Juniors Wednesday at Memorial Park.

With a solid pitching performance by ace Jimmy Chilvers and some timely hitting by Gary Grant and Bruce Beare, the Betz boys improved their home record to 2-0.

Chilvers scattered seven hits and fanned 12, keeping Oshawa hitters off guard with his speed and his darting fastball.

The home side took a 1-0 lead in the first inning when Chilvers helped his own cause by driving in a run with a solid come-backer to the mound. Oshawa pitcher Jimmy Cooke knocked the smash down, but couldn't contain it.

Oshawa tied it in the top of the second, but in the Stouffville half of the inning, Gary Grant drove Bruce Beare home with a single up the middle to put the Betz team up by a run.

Grant led off the fourth with an enormous home run — a laser shot that soared between the left and centrefielders and just kept going. George Burkholder scored on a ground out in the same inning.

Chilvers, who struck out the side in the top of the fifth, came home in the bottom of the inning on a double by Steve Schell. Catcher John Tait crossed the plate

moments later on a fielders choice.

Betz closed out their offensive work with a run-scoring double by Grant in the sixth. Oshawa took advantage of a tiring Chilvers, scoring one last run in the seventh.

Betz manager Bryan Emery was delighted with Grant's performance.
"It was nice to see Gary come

through with a good game," he said.

The manager feels the ever-increasing intensity on the team is a good sign.

"This is what we want," he said. "Low key at the start, then build the momentum as we go along."

The Betz squad takes on first place Greenbank in what promises to be a fiercely contested game tonight (Wednesday).
