MITE GIRLS

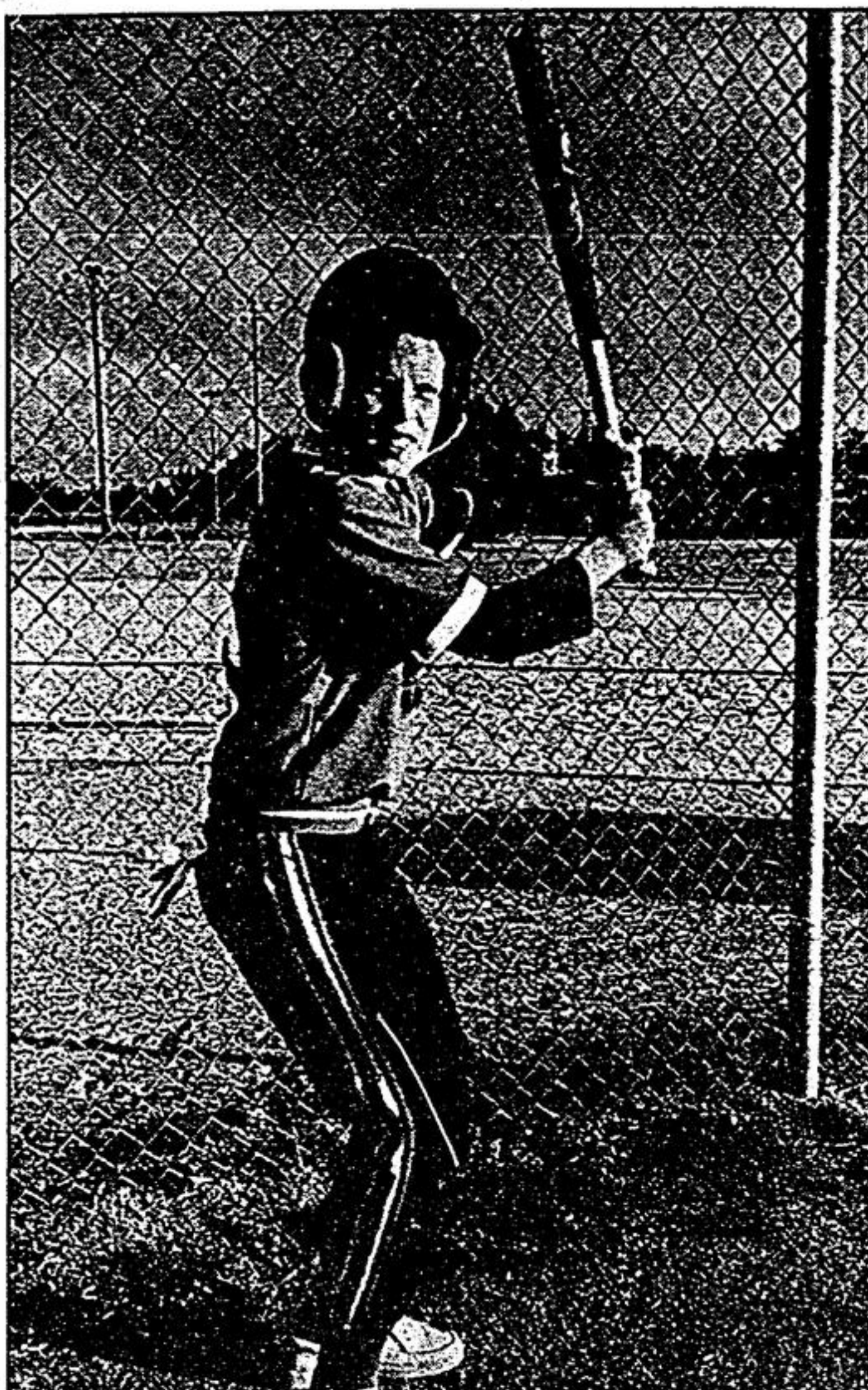
