They were presented with a plate etched with the picture of the church from the U.C.W. To show their appreciation of his work with the choir, they presented him

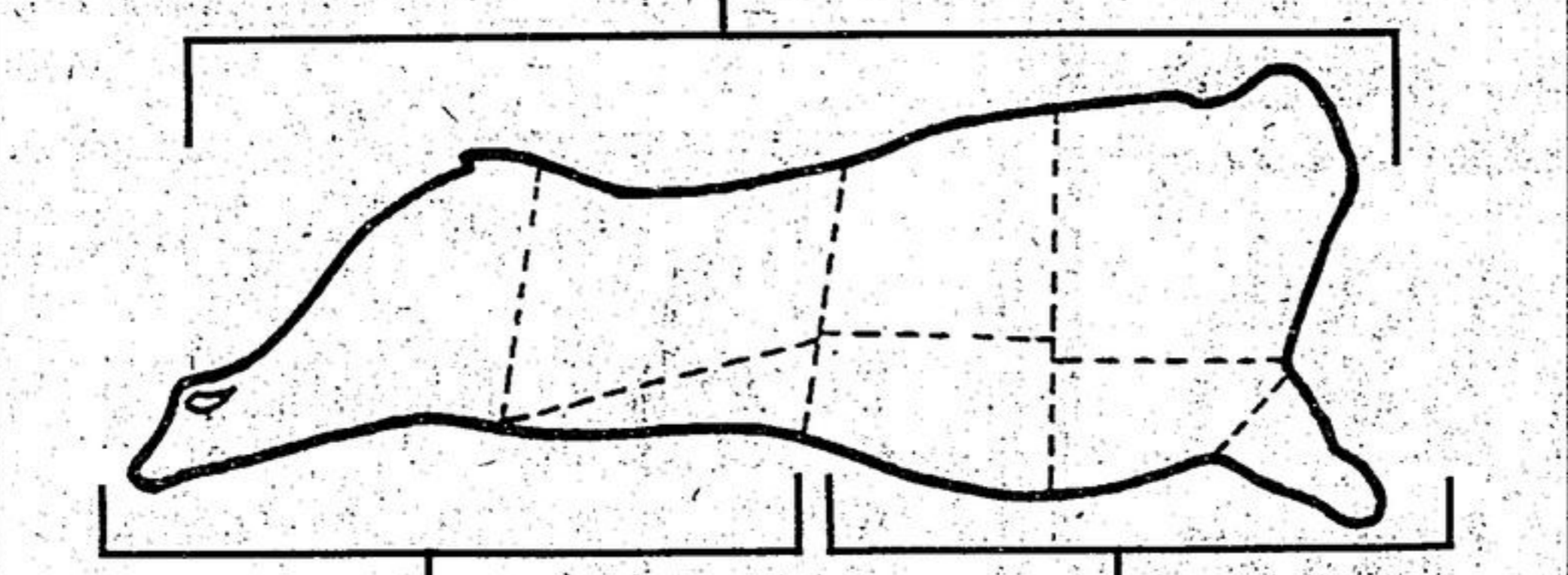
with a picture of the group. One of Mark Barry's paintings was presented to the couple from

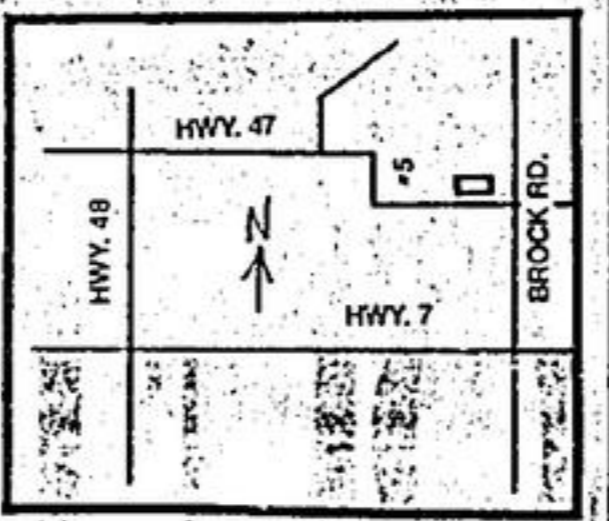
