

Betz Pools dip 5-0 to Oshawa ACL

The Stouffville Betz Pools Fastball team was as cold as the forbidding Wednesday night air, bowing 5-0 to Oshawa ACL.

The game, played in Stouffville, was a pitching duel through the first four innings as Oshawa clung to a slim 1-0 margin.

John Logeman provided the winning RBI when he slashed a wicked low drive just inches inside the third base foul line for a home run.

Betz mounted a threat in the third when Terry Bowles and Steve Schell both singled with one out.

With Bowles on third, Schell was gunned down on an attempted steal of second. Bruce Beare struck out, stranding Bowles.

A great throw from left field by Gary Grant nailed Oshawa's Rich Shoemaker at the plate in the fourth, holding the score at 1-0. Shoemaker was trying to score from second on a single.

In the fifth, it came unglued for Betz, veteran pitcher Jimmy Chilvers.

He gave up a bouncing single to Barry McKenna and a blooper to Chris Kosciesza.

Annis looked like he might pull himself out of yet another jam, striking out Doug Willoughby for

the second out of the inning.

But then Shoemaker blasted a two-strike pitch to right centre to put the game out of reach. The Oshawa slugger tripled in the seventh, coming home on Logeman's single to finish the Oshawa scoring.

Oshawa pitcher Steve Crummy allowed only five Stouffville hits, and had nine strikeouts against no walks. He had the Betz batters off guard all night with his movement, his changeup-curveball and his riseball.

Annis was struggling all night. He gave up 12 safeties while issuing three walks. He struck out

nine.

The only bright spots offensively for Stouffville were doubles hit by Brad Vaughan and Bruce Beare.

The squad also lost to the Scarborough Ambassadors Monday by a 3-2 count. The game was a league game for the Ambassadors, but an exhibition for Stouffville.

Annis pitched the first four innings for the Betz team, with Jimmy Chilvers hurling the final three frames, racking up five strikeouts. John Tait and Doug MacMillan each had two hits for Stouffville.


