Stouffville Florist Inc. extended their inviting window display onto the sidewalk. Marie Kearney holds an eye-catching basket of flowers.

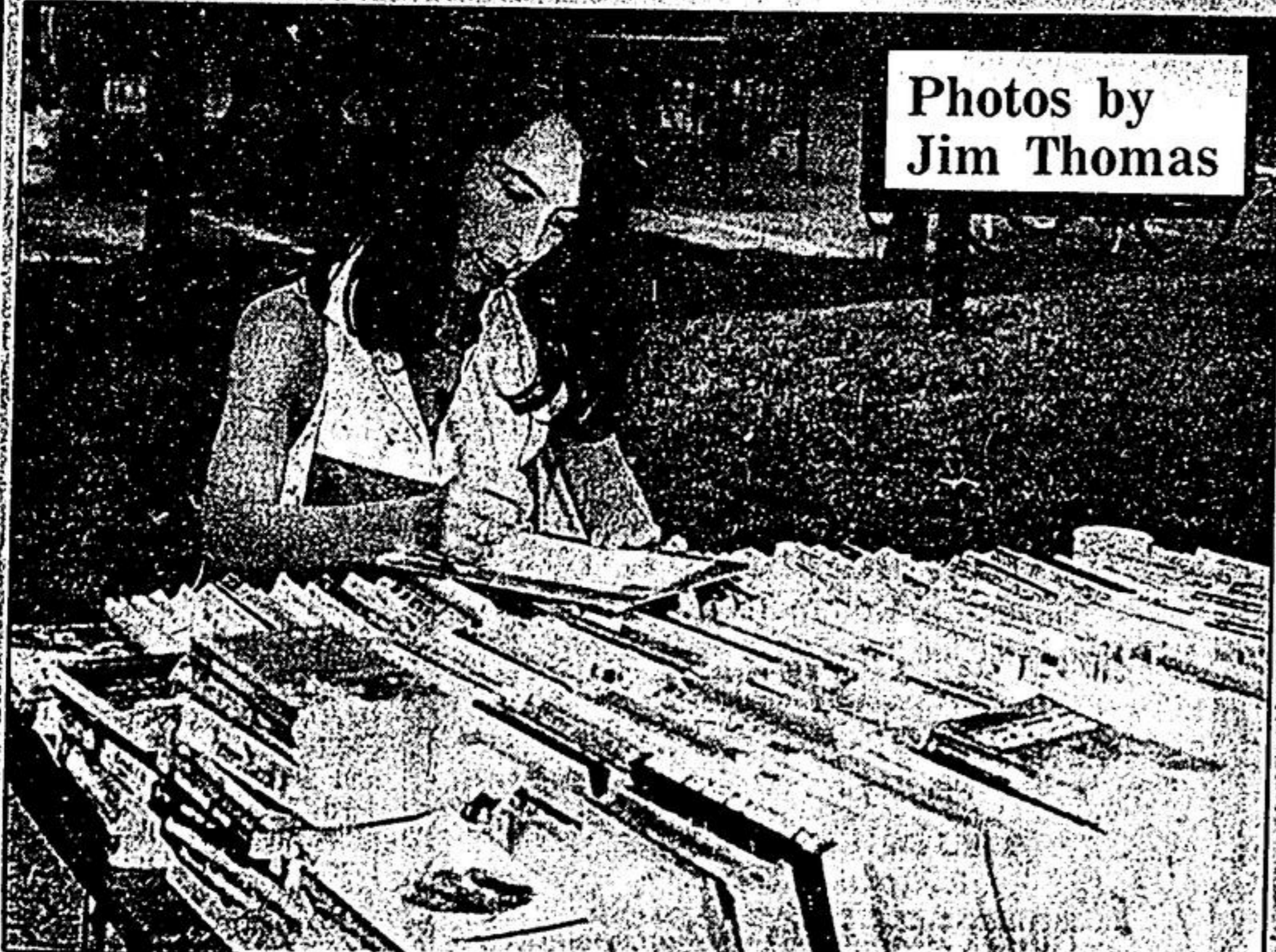


Six-year-old Jennifer Griffin, Manitoba Street, Stouffville, waves to friends. Pony rides, a new activity this year, proved popular.
