Fact finder to aid negotiators

A fact finder has been appointed to help break an impasse in negotiations between the Durham Board of Education and its high school teachers. Professor Brian Sharples — a teacher and the associate dean at Queen's University's faculty of education — has been named to the post by the Ontario government's Education Relations Committee. The two sides have been negotiating since February and the current one-year contract expires today (Aug. 31). Both sides

will meet with Mr. Sharples on Sept. 2 and it will take him two to four weeks to prepare his report. Last September, the two sides reached an agreement two days before the school year began. Teachers were bracing for a strike if negotiations failed after 18 months of negotiations. In his report, Mr. Sharples will clarify outstanding issues and could recommend terms of a settlement. However, his suggestions are not binding on the two parties.
