Hockey association sets up 'B' level rep teams

The Whitchurch-Stouffville Minor Hockey Association will introduce four 'B' level teams to their rep team line-up this coming season, according to its president Jo Anne Steel.

The teams will run from Novice through Bantam, and will be in addition to the first line, or 'A' teams the association has always formed.

"People are asking for it (the 'B' team program) so we'll try it," says Steel. "They will compete against other towns who have 'B' teams."

These 'A' level teams will go from Novice through Midget,

providing sufficient interest is shown in the upper levels, especially Midget. "We've registered through the Ontario Minor Hockey Association for Novice through Midget in Rep hockey," says Steel. "But we'll have to see what kind of turnout we get for the upper age group levels."

Steel is hopeful that there will be a halt to the decline in registrations in the local hockey program that occurred last year. "We're mainly concerned about getting kids to register," she claims. All players must register through the house league system before they will be considered for

rep hockey.

As for the house league, Steel says the lower age levels have shown significant interests, but that, so far, there has not been significant registration action for the upper levels.

"We should do well in Novice and Atom, but beyond that, the kids aren't coming to register."

She says the association has had to dispel rumours circulating that it won't be offering a program for age groups from Pee Wee through Midget in both house league and rep levels. "This is not true," Steel emphasizes. "If we get enough players, we'll have them."

She points out that players who have been inquiring about playing elsewhere, such as in Uxbridge, will not be allowed to compete in those centres if there are teams in Stouffville.

Steel also stresses that players trying out for rep teams must be registered before they can go on the ice for try-outs, which run from Sept. 19-25.

Both house league and rep action will commence early in October.

Registration for the upcoming season can be done at the Rec Of-

fice any week day from 8:30-4:30. Rep level coaches confirmed so far are Dave Turner and Bill Wood for Novice, Bob McKinnon for Atom, and Don Reesor for Pee Wee. Reesor coached last year's Atom entry to the provincial championships.

The WSMHA held its monthly "Trip of the Month" draw at the recent Trade Show at the REC Centre. Winner of a trip for two to Barbados was Greg Rexworthy of Stoney Creek. The \$100 travel voucher was won by John Heepinga of Whitby.

Steel reports that "superfan" Jimmy Clarke, a fixture at all home games of WSMHA rep teams in the past, is hopeful he will be able to attend games this season, despite an operation that resulted in the loss of a leg last year.

"We're reserving his spot," says Steel. "We may need volunteers to see to it he makes it to and from the games."

Rep hockey try-outs for local players begin this week at the Stouffville Recreation Centre.

Players seeking a spot on one of the rep squads must be registered prior to try-outs. Registration is at the Rec office between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.
