Eastern entries won tractor pull

Randy Grant took the honors in the Local Stock class at the Markham Fair Tractor Pull Friday night, but it was the Bowmanville connection that took home most of the loot in the other seven categories.

Grant, a 9th Line farmer, took the 8,000-pound Farmer Class, outpuling three other competitors with his 185 Allis-Chalmers.

The brother tandem of Michael and Blair White of Whitevale placed second and third respectively. Michael drove a Model 1830 John Deere and Blair commanded a 2130 John Deere.

Claremont's Leonard Coburn took second place in the Two-Wheel-Drive Truck Class 5,500-pound division and grabbed third spot in the 5,800 flight. Coburn, part of the Canadian Warrior team that includes his father Arnold and his sister Connie, drove the flamboyant Canadian Warrior II, a 1923 Ford Bucket T Coupe, with a 458 Blown engine.

Coburn had won both classes at this year's Uxbridge Fair, but was unable to really master the track at Markham, which was soft and loose, according to Arnold Coburn.

Bowmanville's Roger Cochran took first place in both the Two-Wheel-Drive events, aboard his 572-cubic-inch Ford called More Whiskey.

Fellow Bowmanville resident Charlie Hynes was second in the 5,500-pound pull in a 541-cubic-inch Ford called Carrot Top. Terry Mason, also of Bowmanville, was third in the 5,800-pound event with his 1947 Mercury one-ton, equipped with a 468 Chev engine.

In the 5,200-pound Modified Tractor Class, it was Bowmanville again, with Larry Luxton grabbing first spot in a 454 Chev called Aggravation, and Jerry Brown taking second with his 454 Chev named Troublemaker.

Third position was won by Lakefield's Vaughan Hill, also with a 454 Chev called Sobduster.

Mark Kangas of Ariss, Ontario, captured the Pro Stock 5,500-pound class in an 880 Oliver Diesel. Tyrone's Chris Vaneyk in his 880 Oliver came second, while Don White of Whitevale took third with a Cockshutt 1650. There were only three entered in the division.

Bowmanville's Wayne Allen placed first in the Modified Tractors 6,000-pound event, driving a 454 Chev called Whiplash. It was Larry Luxton second, while Dick Reid of Nobleton took third spot in his Olds 455, Black Magic. There were eight entries in all.

Earle Trewin of Blackstock was tops in the 13,000-pound Pro Stock Class, with an Allis-Chalmers Model D-21, equipped with a 426 fuel-injected engine.

Grand Valley's Glen Garland was second in an International 1086 with a 414 fuel-injected engine. Bob Richards of Barrie was third in an International. There were four entrants.






Winners in the local and Pro Stock classes shared \$400 in prize money per class, while winners in the Modified Tractor and Truck events split \$500 per division.
