Traffic lights in offing

LINCOLNVILLE — The intersection of Hwy. 47 and the Bloomington Road could soon be protected by automatic traffic lights.

Steve Wasylyszyn, senior municipal supervisor with the Ministry of Transportation has informed Whitchurch-Stouffville Council that the design is now complete but formal approval is required from the district.

If the tender comes within the estimate set by the Ministry, work on the project could begin the middle of this month, Mr. Wasylyszyn says.

If the cost is excessive, installation could be cancelled, the official warns.

The intersection has long been the concern of both Uxbridge and Whitchurch-Stouffville Councils in particular members Ron Robb and Cal Avery.

Horseplay at Markham Fair

Markham Fair's most colorful light horse exhibitors made their mark in this year's competition, with record turnouts for Saturday's event.

The Pinto Horse, frequently associated with children's carousels in days of old, outnumbered other breeds two to one, with Overo, Tobiano and other splashy horse and rider combinations coming from as far away as Staff, Tottenham and Toronto to compete.

According to Light Horse

Chairman Carrie Purcell, the increase can be credited to a new competition time slot on Saturday afternoon rather than Saturday evening.

"The Pinto Horse is a relative newcomer to the Fair," she said. "And now they don't have to compete in the cold and dark, their numbers are increasing every year."

Stouffville's Karen Rabjohn, riding Chief Bear Paw was especially grateful for the added competition.

The pair earned a second place ribbon in the Overo color class, third in Pinto, Hunter Type, another third in Hunter Under Saddle, fourth in Senior Horse English Pleasure, sixth in English and reserve in Disciplined Rail Horse.

Don Peers and Poco Toy's Paycheck from Mount Albert made an equally impressive

showing, securing first in Youth Amateur Showmanship, 14-18 years, second in Tobiano Color Class, and third in two year and under mare competition.

Unionville's Anita Van Hezewyk was honored with three first place finishes and one championship, riding The Desperado, Northwinds Mr. Sparkie and Jenny Lynn.
