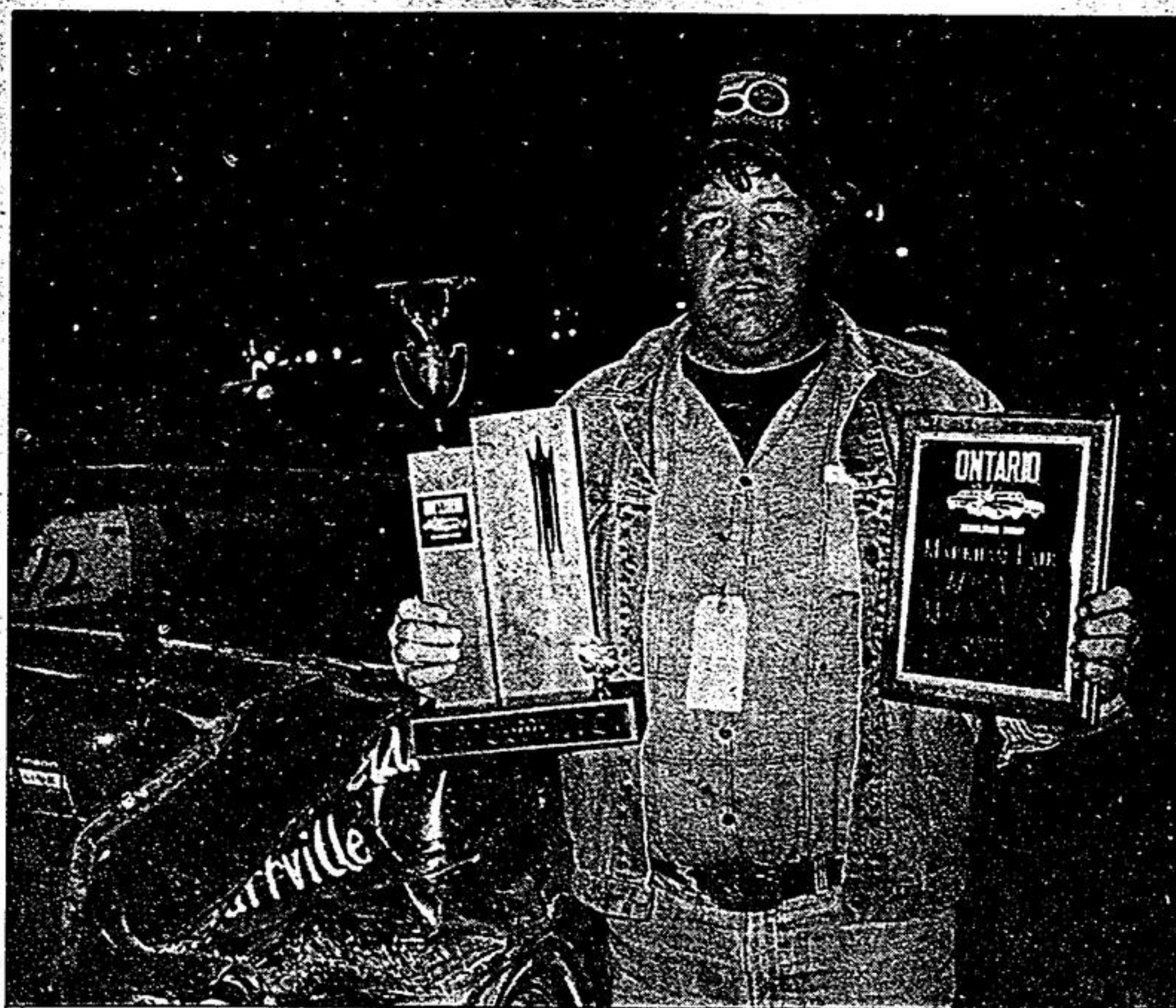


# Derby debut a smashing time

 Bob Angliss' first-ever wreckem race experience turned out to be a big smash for the Stouffville Progress Club.  
 The 41-year-old Altona man ran roughshod over the competition in capturing the honors in the Markham Fair Demolition Derby Thursday night in a 1976 Olds 88.  
 The car was donated to the local service club by Stouffville's Giles Chev-olds, which had taken the car as a trade-in.  
 The club, which has entered cars in several demolition derbies, handed the keys to Angliss, a club member, when their regular driver was away on vacation.

The employee of Canada Building Materials in Oshawa rammed his way to victory in the first heat, and then came back to outlast four others in the feature.  
 He announced after the event that the \$460 in prize money would be given to the Progress Club.  
 "When I started the first heat, I didn't even figure on finishing," said Angliss.  
 He claims he has no strategy. "I was just out there to have fun, and try not to get hit in the rad," he said.  
 He's doubtful his success will result in his following the demolition derby circuit in the future, even though he enjoyed his first foray.  
 "I loved it. I should have had my mother-in-law in the back seat," he joked.

# Fiddler duel at Markham Fair

 Saturday night's Oldtime Fiddlers' Contest in the entertainment tent at Markham Fair had a packed crowd tapping their feet to the music of 17 talented entries.  
 The contest was divided into four categories: 18 and under, 19-59, 60 and over and an open class for all age groups.  
 Competitors were eligible to enter both their own age group and the open class. Entrants played a waltz, a jig and a reel of their choice. Eleven people took part.  
 The first place winner in the open class received a plaque and \$150; 2nd prize was \$100 and 3rd was \$75. In all other classes, the winner received a plaque and \$50, the runner up received \$35 and the third prize was \$25.

Prizes were awarded as follows: 18 and under: 1st — Jay Wieler of Ariss, Ont.; 2nd — Jessica Wieler, also of Ariss, (no third). 19-59: 1st — Bruce Woods of Fergus, Ont.; 2nd — Murray Kronis of Penetanguishene, Ont.; 3rd — Larry Sinai of Mississauga. 60 and over: 1st — Alice Urecko of Toronto; 2nd — Earl Giles of Scarborough; 3rd — Bill White of Scarborough.  
 The big winner in the open class was Michelle Lubinecki of Scarborough; 2nd — Scott Woods of Fergus; 3rd — Randy Morrison of Rexdale.  
 Michelle, who has been playing for 14 years, also took second prize in a major contest at Shelburne, Ontario this year, one of only two women to receive an award for that event in 38 years.
