The former Sarco Plant, Brock Road North, Claremont, is up for sale.

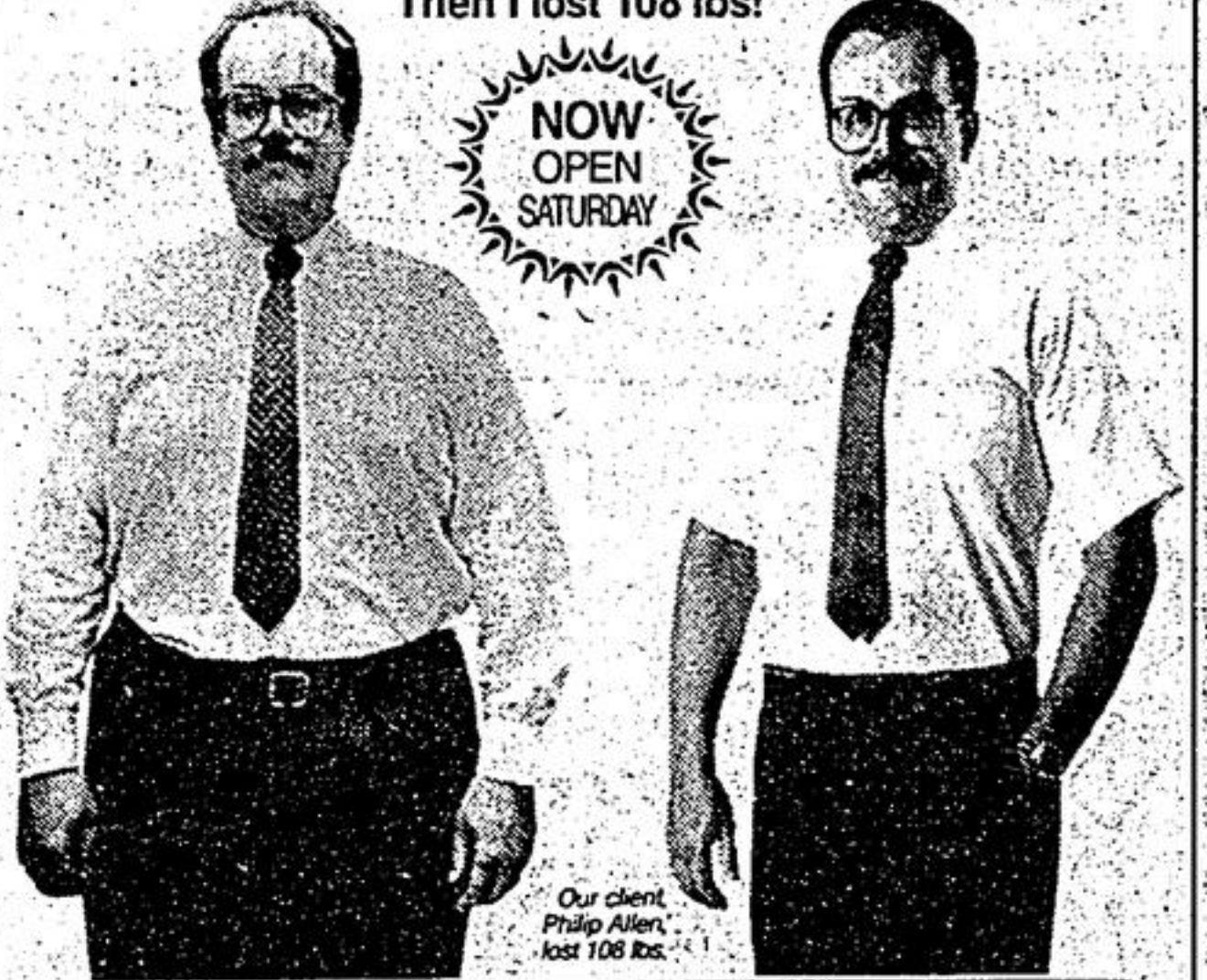
The asking price is \$450,000. R. Villani Real Estate Ltd., Toronto, has the listing.

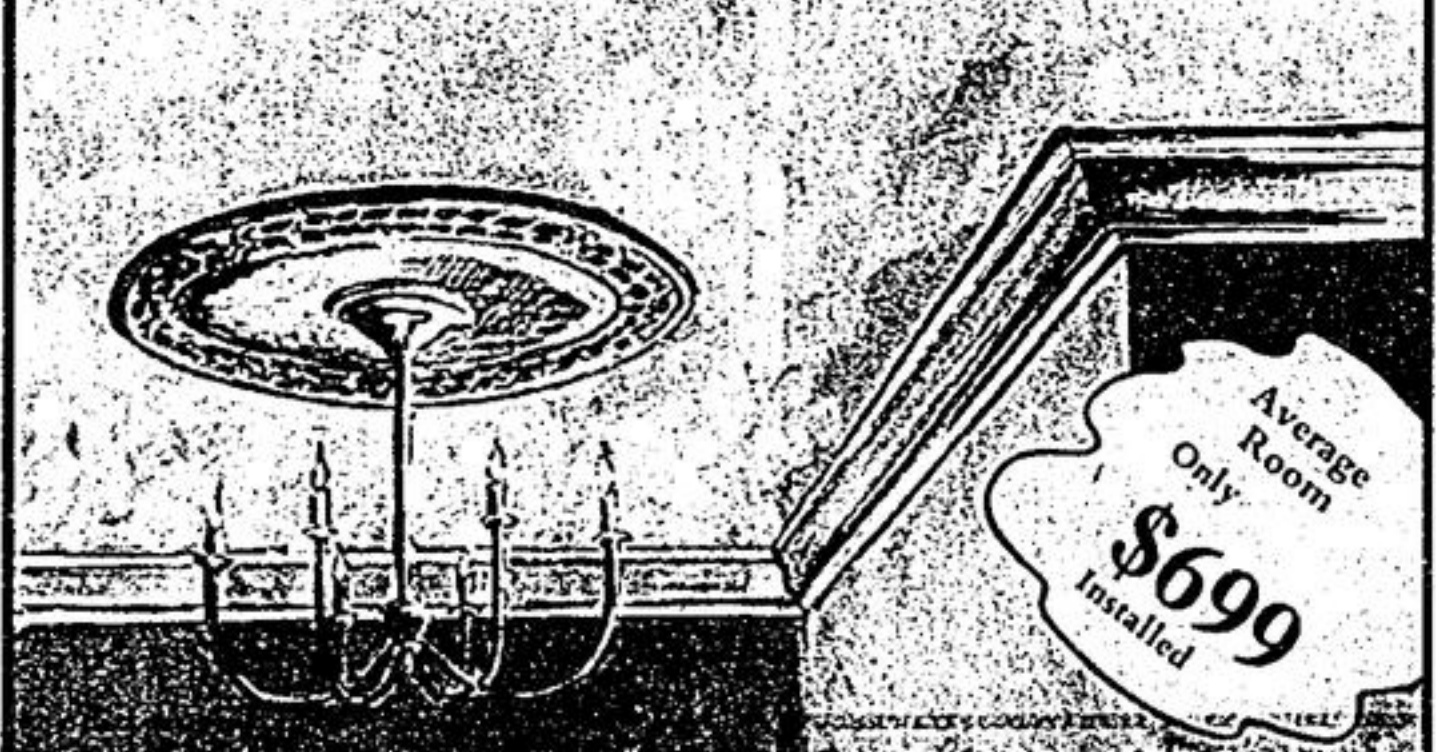

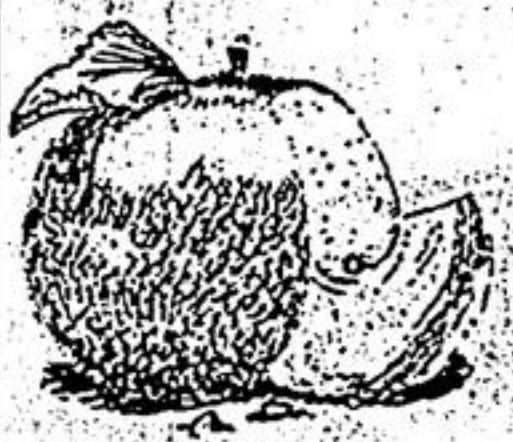

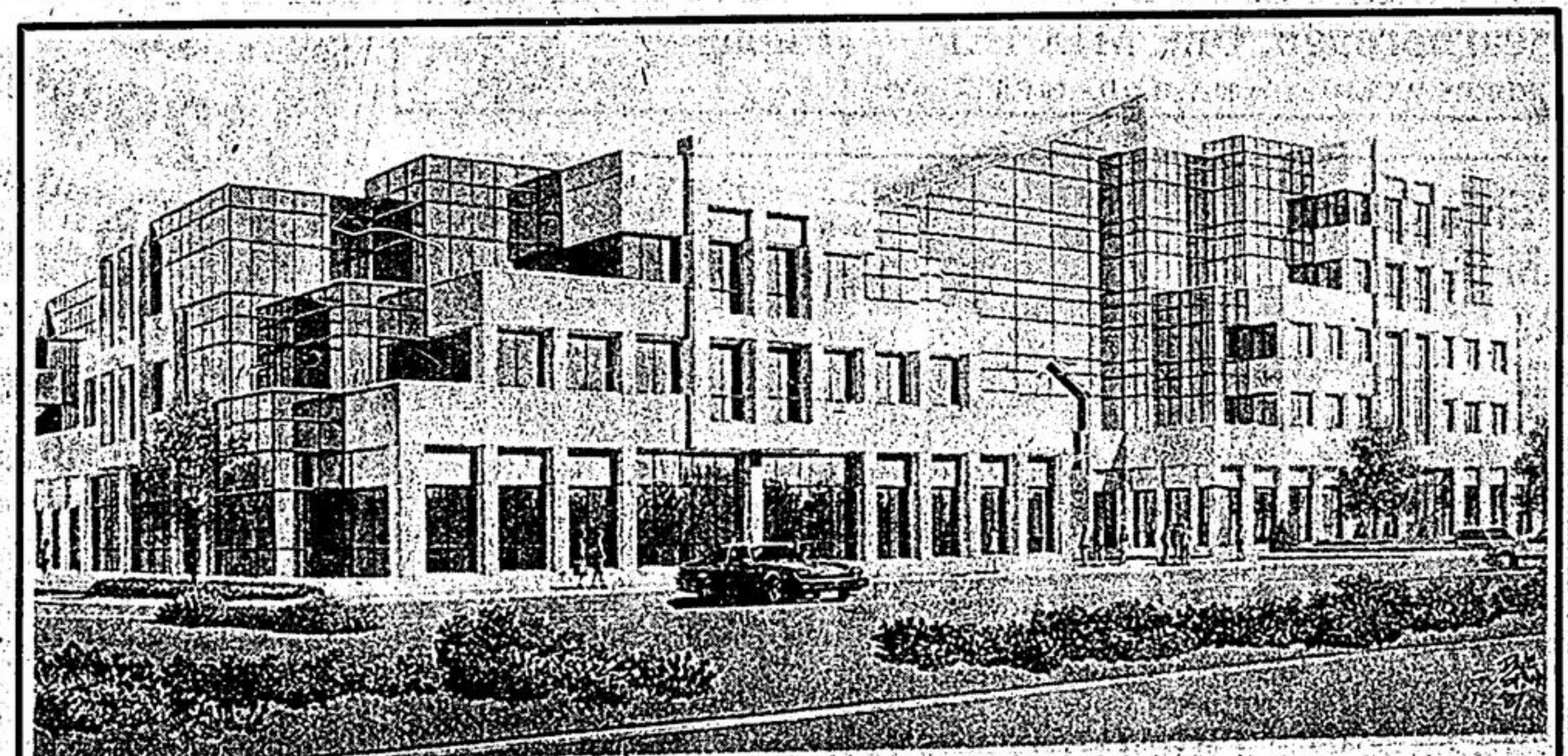
