
## Male choir to visit Heise Hill

## Long-time PC member

Former York North MPP Bill Hodgson, who represented areas of Whitechurch-Stouffville for 18 years, has died of cancer at his Kettleby home. He was 76. Mr. Hodgson spent more than 35 years in public service in York Region, working in various capacities and building a solid political career.

He represented York North for the Progressive Conservatives from 1967 to 1985, when he was defeated by Liberal Greg Sorbara. In York Region, he will be remembered for his work in establishing Newmarket's provincial courthouse and for garnering provincial funds for the much-needed Hwy 404.

Funeral services for Mr. Hodgson were held Saturday at York Pines United Church in Kettleby. He was buried nearby at Kettleby Cemetery. He is survived by his wife of 52 years, Eliza, and his children Bob, David, Beth MacLellan and Janice Auld. He also has nine grandchildren and one great-grandchild.
