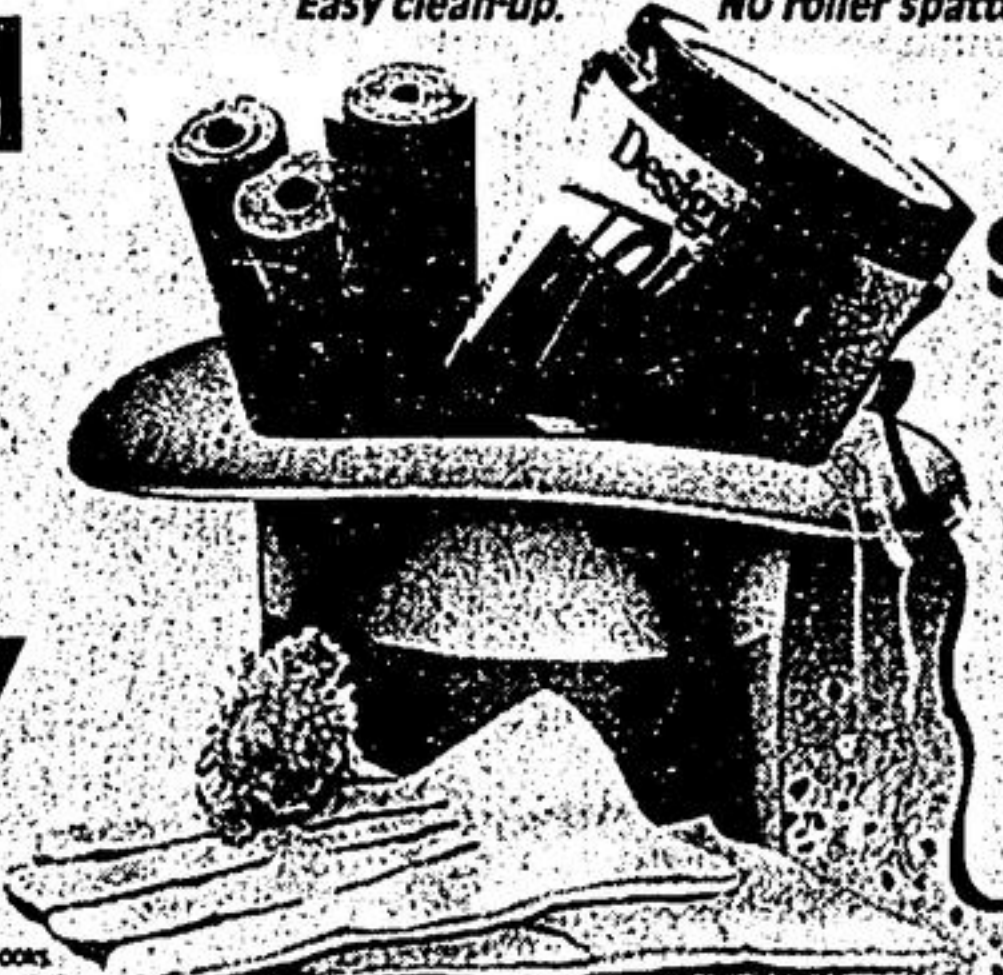

### NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, known municipally as 16 Wellington Street, Markham being Block E, Lot 2, Part Lots 1 and 3, Registered Plan 18 as a property of architectural and/or historic interest or value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The John Jerman House is recommended for designation for its historical and architectural significance.

The house was built in 1886 by John Jerman a member of Markham Village Council from its incorporation in 1873 until 1882. Architecturally the house is a fine example of late Victorian architecture and functions as a gateway to the Markham heritage district.
