Paper drive Saturday

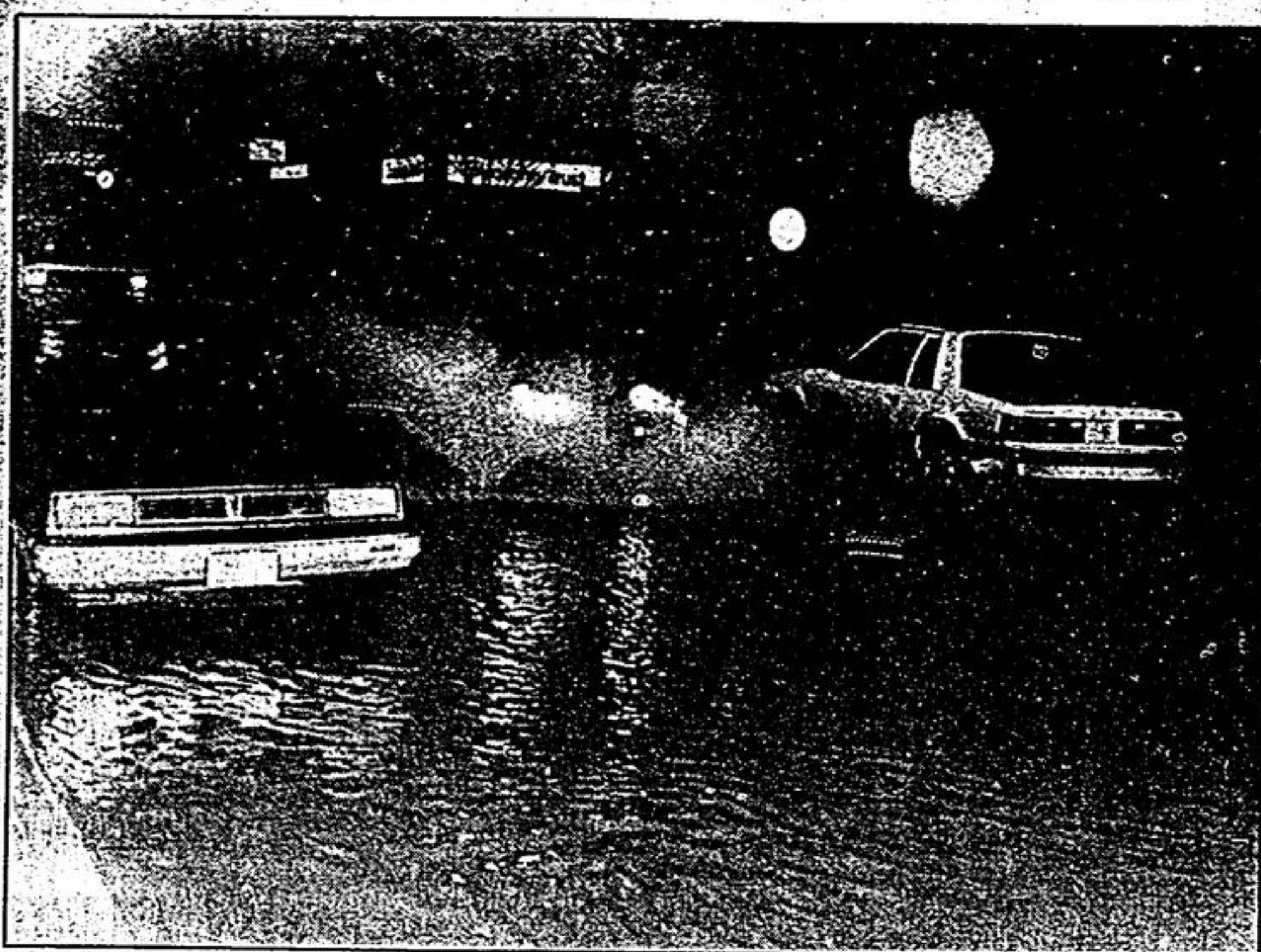
On Sat., Nov. 12, the Stouffville Scouts and Cubs will hold a fall Paper Drive beginning at 9 a.m.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The John Jerman House is recommended for designation for its historical and architectural significance.

The house was built in 1886 by John Jerman a member of Markham Village Council from its incorporation in 1873 until 1882. Architecturally the house is a fine example of late Victorian architecture and functions as a gateway to the Markham heritage district.
