It was fitting that Mrs. Frisby should be brought 'home' to the church that served as her 'second home' for so many years. She was the member of longest standing in the congregation.

Mrs. Frisby, the former Mabel Caldwell, was born at Crown Hill near Barrie, one of nine in the family of William and Elizabeth Caldwell.

Following her marriage, Sept. 15, 1920, she and her husband farmed on 18th Avenue, Markham, between Warden and Woodbine Avenues. When Mr. Frisby died in January, 1947 at the age of only 52, she continued to occupy her own apartment there. At the same time, she en-
