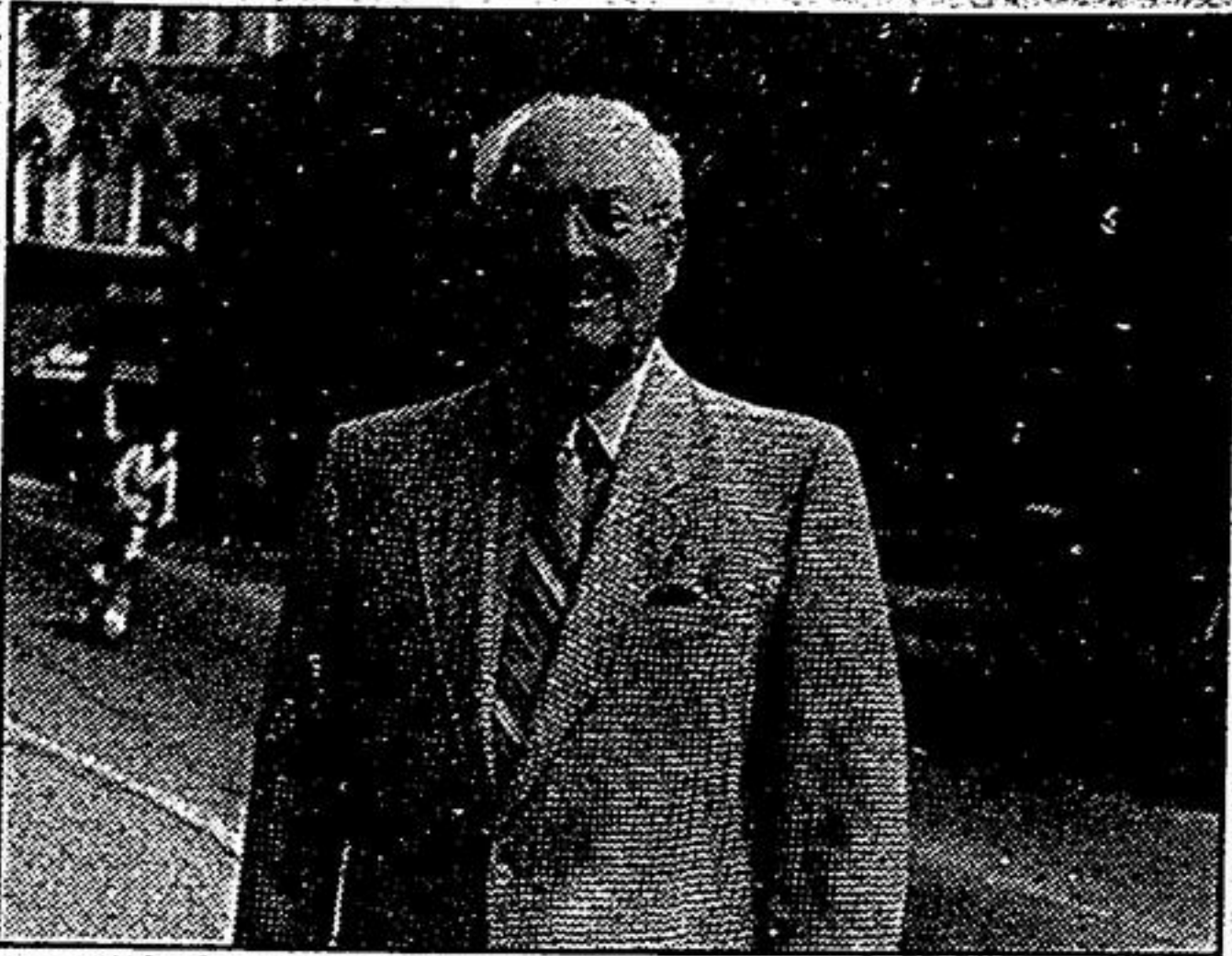

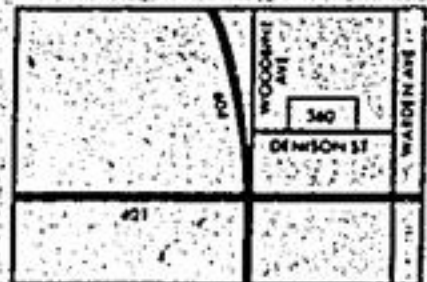

## TOWN OF MARKHAM PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD

### VACANCIES

TAKE NOTICE that there are five (5) vacancies on the Town of Markham Public Library Board and that the Council of the Town of Markham is hereby inviting applications from persons interested in being considered for appointment to fill such vacancies for the term which expires on November 30th, 1991.

A person is eligible for appointment to the Town of Markham Public Library Board if he or she is:

- (a) at least eighteen (18) years of age;
- (b) a Canadian Citizen; and
- (c) a resident of the Town of Markham.

The Town of Markham Public Library Board holds regular meetings during the evening of the third Monday of each month from January to June and from September to December. Attendance at special Board or Board Committee meetings may also be required from time to time. There is no remuneration paid to a person who is appointed as a member of the Board, except allowable expenses in attending meetings of the Board or Committees thereof. Further information relating to the duties of the Library Board and terms of reference for Library Board Committees is available in the Clerk's Office at 8911 Woodbine Avenue or from the Head Librarian at any Community Branch Public Library.

Persons interested in being considered for appointment to the Town of Markham Public Library Board should file a written application in the office of the Town Clerk by no later than Thursday, January 19th, 1989.

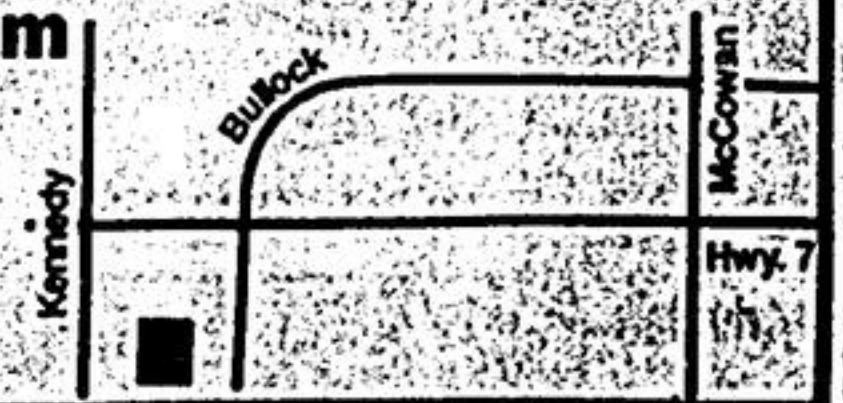
