STOUFFVILLE — Mrs. Stella Weatherill, a beloved mother, grandmother and great-grandmother, passed away Dec. 6 at Green Gables Manor, Bloomington.

She would have marked her 98th birthday, Jan. 22, 1989.

Mrs. Weatherill, the former Stella Coulson, was born at Zephyr, one of three in the family of Aaron and Martha (Barker) Coulson.

At age two, her parents moved to Conc. 6, (Kennedy Road), Markham. The farm property is now part of York Downs Golf and Country Club.

She attended Cody Corners Public School.

Following her marriage to Robert Weatherill, they continued to live at Unionville where Mrs. Weatherill was active in the Methodist and later the United Church. She was a member of the church choir. She was also active in the Women's Institute and work of the Red Cross.

Mrs. Weatherill enjoyed quilting. She completed her last quilt at age 84.

Mr. Weatherill predeceased his wife in 1969. Mrs. Weatherill then kept house for her brother, Professor John Coulson at McDonald College, McGill University, Montreal. Later, they took up residence in The Village Squire Apartments, Markham.

Following the death of Prof. Coulson, Mrs. Weatherill resided for a time with her son and daughter-in-law, Lloyd and Kathleen Weatherill, Pavillion Street, Unionville.

"Everything we did for her, she did double for us," Lloyd said.

She'd been a resident of Green Gables since 1984.

Besides an only son, she survived by grandchildren Terry and Anita Weatherill, Rupert Avenue, Stouffville, and three great-grandchildren, Lisa, Christopher and Jessica.

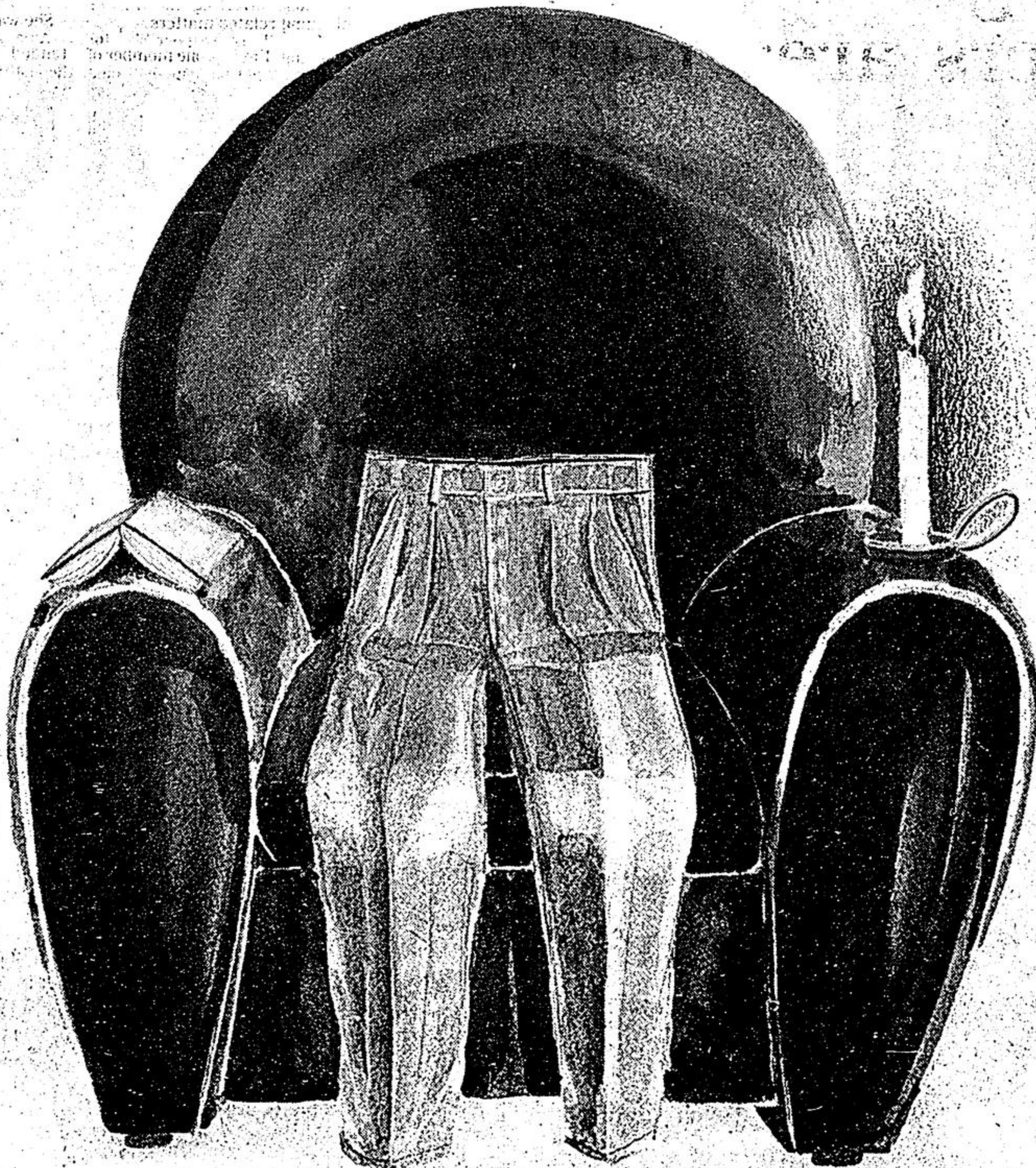
