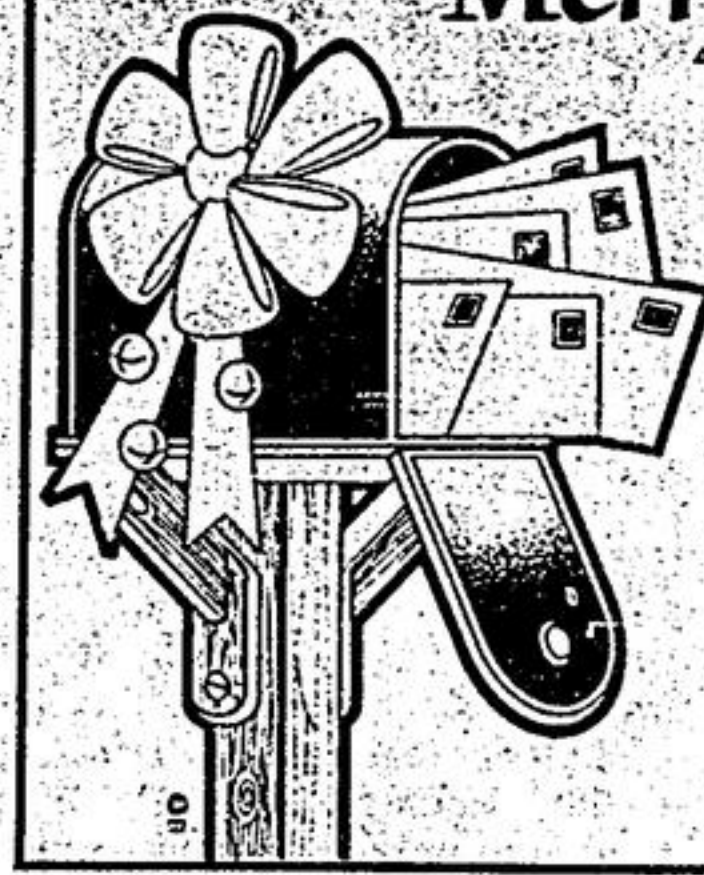

What's in a name?

STOUFFVILLE - Two new names have been added to the street-naming committee, doubling its size. Councillors Jim Sanders and Nick Tatone will join Jim Rae and Jean Barkey, it was decided at Tuesday's council meeting.

The committee is designed to give input into the process of naming the streets in new subdivisions. It receives a list of possible names from the developer, goes over the list, deleting names that are not suitable for the area and adding names that reflect the historic ownership of the property.

This list is then submitted to the Region, which has the final say on whether or not a name can be used.

If there is already a street called by one of the names in a neighboring municipality, that name is not usable here. It appears from recent decisions of the Region that "neighboring" municipalities are as close as Huntsville, since a proposed name was turned down because it was in use there.

The most recently named street in Whitchurch-Stouffville is Elia Dr. in the new Emerald Hills subdivision, Lot 19, Con. 5, Whitchurch, which was brought before Council Tuesday evening.

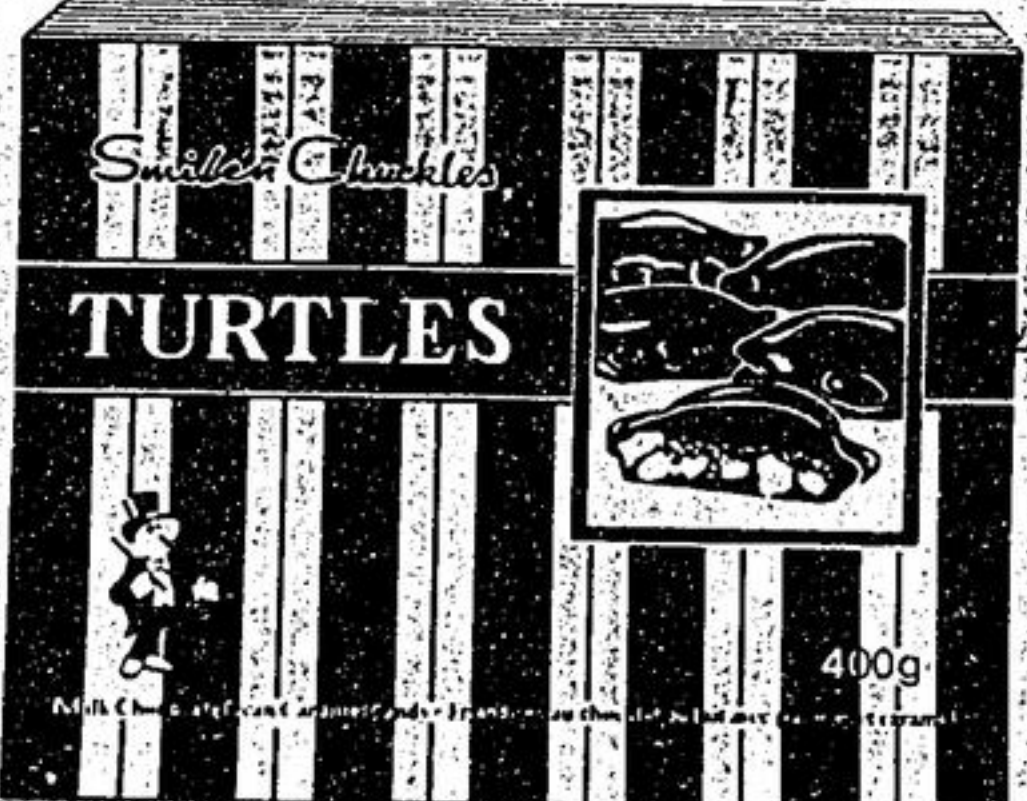

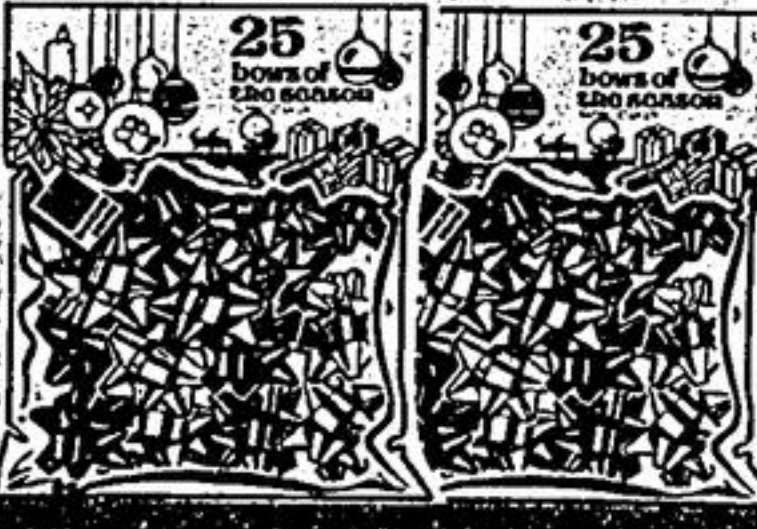

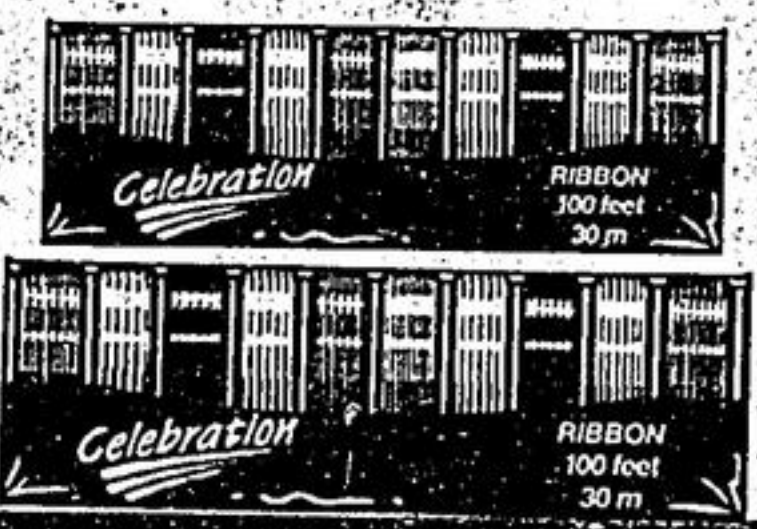
