Late Frank Reesor

A wide circle of friends

STOUFFVILLE — Frank Reesor, everyone's friend at Parkview Village, Stouffville, passed away suddenly, Jan. 7 in Scarborough Centenary Hospital where he'd been a patient only one day. He was 80.

Mr. Reesor, a soft-spoken, kindly man, enjoyed the company of others. He had a wide circle of friends.

Days of his youth and boyhood years spent on the farm were memories he loved to recall. He was intensely interested in the life of early pioneers.

Mr. Reesor was born on the 10th Conc. of Markham, Oct. 21, 1908. He was proud of his heritage, a descendent of Christian Reesor who, with his family, came to Cedar Grove from Pennsylvania in 1804.

Following retirement from the farm in 1965, Frank and Ella Reesor moved to Main Street North, Markham. For a period of ten years, Mr. Reesor was a member of the custodian staff at

Markham Dist. High School. In 1985, they took up residence at Parkview Village.

Mr. Reesor had a close association with the congregation of Zion United Church, Cedar Grove. He served as a steward, a member of session and a secretary of the Sunday School.

Besides his wife, the former Ella Rittenhouse, Mr. Reesor is survived by a daughter, and son-in-law, Carol and Lorne Smith.

Survival law irritates Robb

BALLANTRAE — Councillor Ron Robb voiced strong opposition to a zoning change, Jan. 10, that would allow a fourth variety-type store in Ballantrae.

"Can 2,500 people really sup-

port four stores?" he asked. He requested a marketing study to show the need.

"I don't want to see people who've been in business many years, go under," he stated.

Mayor Fran Sainsbury maintained that an additional store would provide competition. "In many ways, it's survival of the fittest," she said.

A recorded vote, requested by Councillor Robb, won support from Councillors Margot Marshall and Wayne Emmerson. Mayor Sainsbury and Councillors Jim Sanders, Doug Alles and Nick Tatone favored the zoning change.
