

The purpose of this study is to evaluate the historic core of the former village of Markham for designation as a Heritage Conservation District under Part V of the Ontario Heritage Act. The study area is centred around Hwy. 48 from as far south as Vinegar Hill including Princess and Rouge Streets northwards to just beyond 16th Avenue (see map above).

The OPEN HOUSE will allow residents to review the data collected to date and the Terms of Reference of the study. Staff will be on hand to answer questions regarding the historical growth of the area and what the designation of a Heritage District means to the citizens of Markham.

The Corporation of the Town of Markham has retained Project Planning Limited to undertake the work and, as the study progresses, further findings and recommendations will be presented at an ongoing series of public meetings and open houses. We look forward to your input and thank you for your cooperation.
