

Bruins player hangs tough in face of injury

It's been one of those seasons for Aaron McWilliams. The 17-year-old, 13-year veteran of the Whitby

Stouffville minor hockey program was one of the last cuts with the Markham Junior 'B' Laidlaws this past fall, but managed to catch on with the Ux-

bridge Junior 'C' Bruins.

The hard-nosed youngster with the mild-mannered off-the-ice temperament fits in well with the struggling Bruins, providing them a rugged rearguard capable of making things happen on the power play with his laser-like, ankle high, slap shot from the point.

He even managed to cut back considerably on a penalty count that served to diminish his effectiveness as part of the Stouffville Midget Clippers last season.

Aaron was an easy target for those players who like to sneak a quick illegal shot at an opposition player while the referee's back is turned.

The result: the man in the black and white stripes turns around just in time to catch the victim's reflex-like retaliatory infraction.

Aggressive

A solid, well-built kid, Aaron had succeeded in avoiding serious injuries in the past, despite the willingness to play a somewhat aggressive brand of hockey.

But a torn rotator cuff back in the late fall caused him to miss five games.

He returned to action knowing, as the doctor had told him, it would probably cause him further trouble.

Sure enough, just after he'd gotten back in the groove, he went up against the boards with a Little Britain player in a game Jan. 13 and wound up dislocating the shoulder, as well as tearing ligaments and muscles.

He had to be helped from the arena, was treated at hospital, and released. The doctor told him he was through for the year, but now he has concerns about whether or not he'll ever be able to play again.

Operation

"Before I can even consider playing again, I'll have to have an operation to shorten the ligaments and tendons in order to tighten the socket," he claims.

If determination has anything to do with it, then we'll probably see Aaron back in harness, hopefully next season. He wants to play, perhaps reach the Junior 'B' level.

Before the injury, he had improved, and was working on his weaknesses, which he sees as being his skating and his stick-handling.

Pleased

"But I was pleased with my play. My shot was working well."

That in itself is enough to strike fear in the hearts of goalies everywhere. And when combined with a hoped-for depth of maturity that would teach him

discipline is more important than worrying about what's fair or unfair, Aaron would have seemed to be on his way towards reaching his peak as a hockey player.

But for now, it's a matter of waiting and hoping. Fortunately,

he has youth on his side, and it could be with a proper conditioning program, Aaron will be back in top form by the fall.

Until then, he's still involved in the game, as coach of the Stouffville Atom 'B' Clippers.
