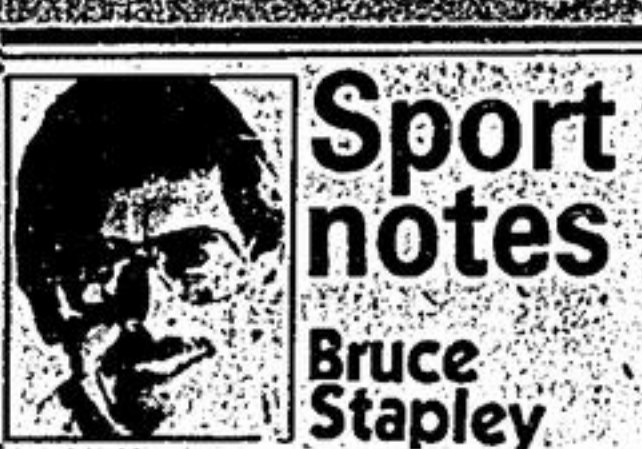
Still a little cold for playing baseball

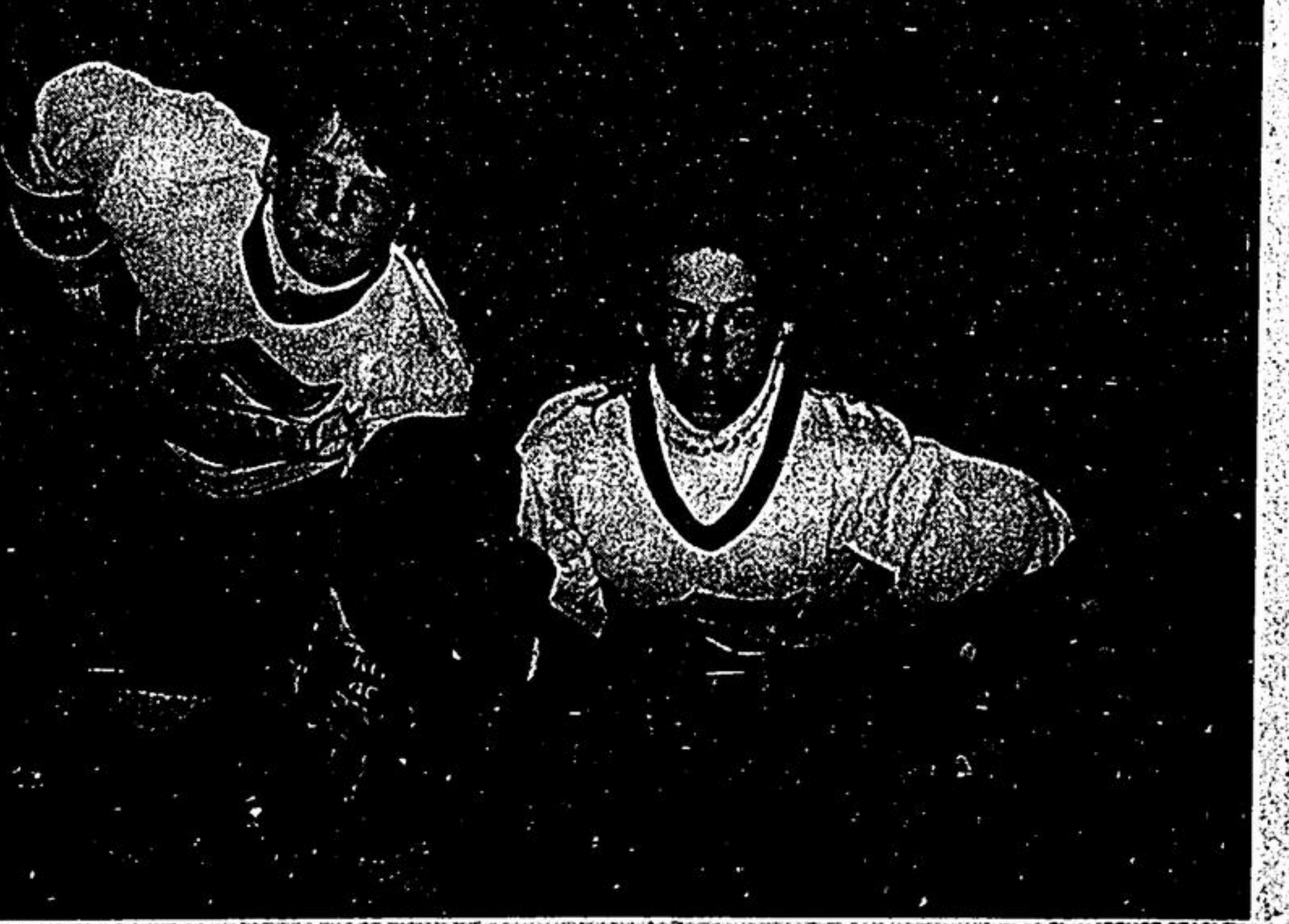
