Easy does it on stones

STOUFFVILLE — Cemetery boards would be well advised not to over-react to recommendations resulting from a coroner's inquest held at Woodstock, Dec. 3, 1987.

This is the word from Reg Tompkinson, owner of Uxbridge Memorial Company, 108 Brock Street West.

Mr. Tompkinson was responding to concerns voiced by the Lemonville Cemetery Board in Whitchurch-Stouffville, following the death of Kristie Vandescheur, July 15, 1987.

The four-year-old died from a ruptured heart when a tombstone at Quaker Cemetery, Norwich Twp., toppled on her.

In a letter to council, Jean Barkey of the Lemonville Board said members had expressed concern over the condition of sectional stones in that cemetery. A repair cost of \$400 per monument was mentioned.

Mr. Tompkinson describes this figure as "ridiculously high". He claims no municipality could afford this kind of expense.

The problem with most tomb-

stones is a deterioration of the base, he says. "In some cases, a slight touch will topple them," he notes.

Mr. Tompkinson says a figure of between \$75 and \$200 is more reasonable. In one instance, he renovated an entire burial ground for less than \$2,000.

Mr. Tompkinson claims the strengthening of all sectional stones is a coroner's jury recommendation and not a government order.

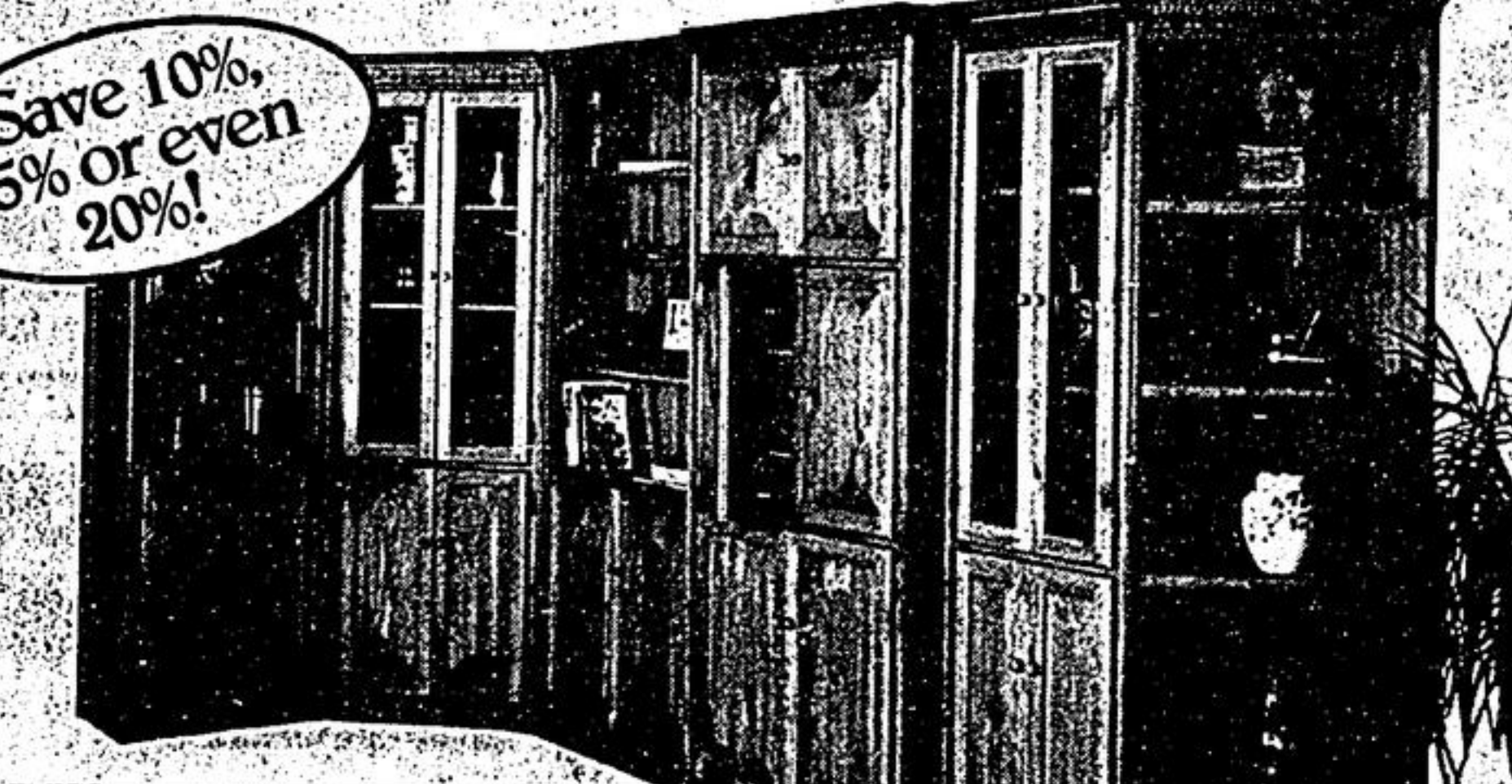
"Cemetery boards shouldn't panic," he concluded.

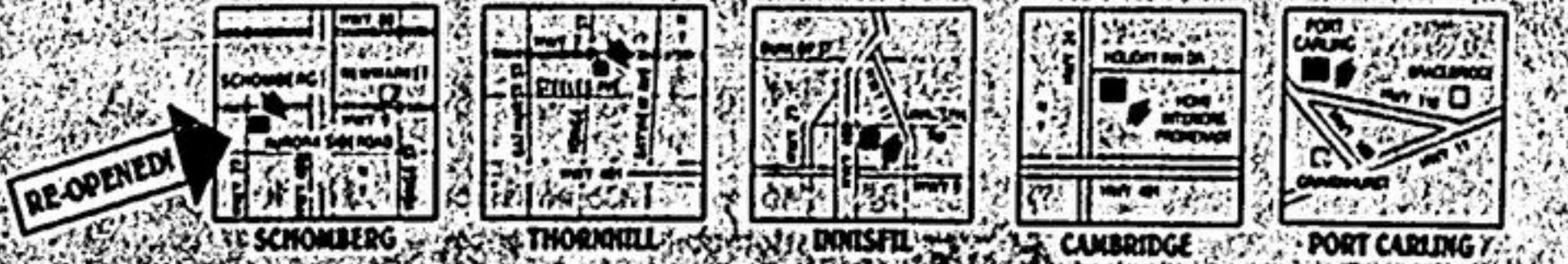
