Request wetland protection

WHITCHURCH — A small, unnamed lake is located at Lots 13 and 14, on the west side of Kennedy Road between the Bloomington and Vandorf Sideroads.

Don and Karen Chubbuck, R.R. 4, Stouffville, want the site recognized as an environmentally significant area in Whitchurch-Stouffville's Official Plan.

They feel other adjacent properties, not identified by the Town, should also be included.

Mr. and Mrs. Chubbuck describe their lake as similar to many found in the Oak Ridges Moraine. It drains into the Vandorf Creek.

"Although the lake, that we live on, is not designated as a provincially or regionally significant wetland, it has been designated as an Area of Natural and Scientific Interest by the Ministry of Natural Resources and therefore subject to a tax rebate," the home-owners explain.

They want this lake and two adjacent wetlands recognized as part of the Town's Environmentally Significant Area.

They'd also like to see the Area extended.

"The importance of these natural areas should not be underestimated in the light of historical wetland losses in southern Ontario and the present degree of development in the Town," they stress. "Such areas should be considered for future inclusion in the Official Plan."

Mr. and Mrs. Chubbuck conclude: "Wetlands are important to all of us. They maintain and improve our water quality. They are vital to our water supply, recharging the water table, retarding runoff, reducing the possibility of flooding and keeping streams at constant flow levels. Wetlands also provide for a diversity and abundance of wildlife and plant species that in turn provide selected outdoor recreational opportunities. We trust you, (Town Council), will appreciate our concerns. We would encourage your efforts to preserve the natural environment of the Town in balance with the many other land-use requirements."

Copies of the letter have been sent to MPP Bill Ballinger, York Regional Chairman Eldred King and John Riley of the Ministry of Natural Resources, Central Region.

In the Class for Poetry, Six Years and Under, Marianna also placed first. Her mark was 85 percent.

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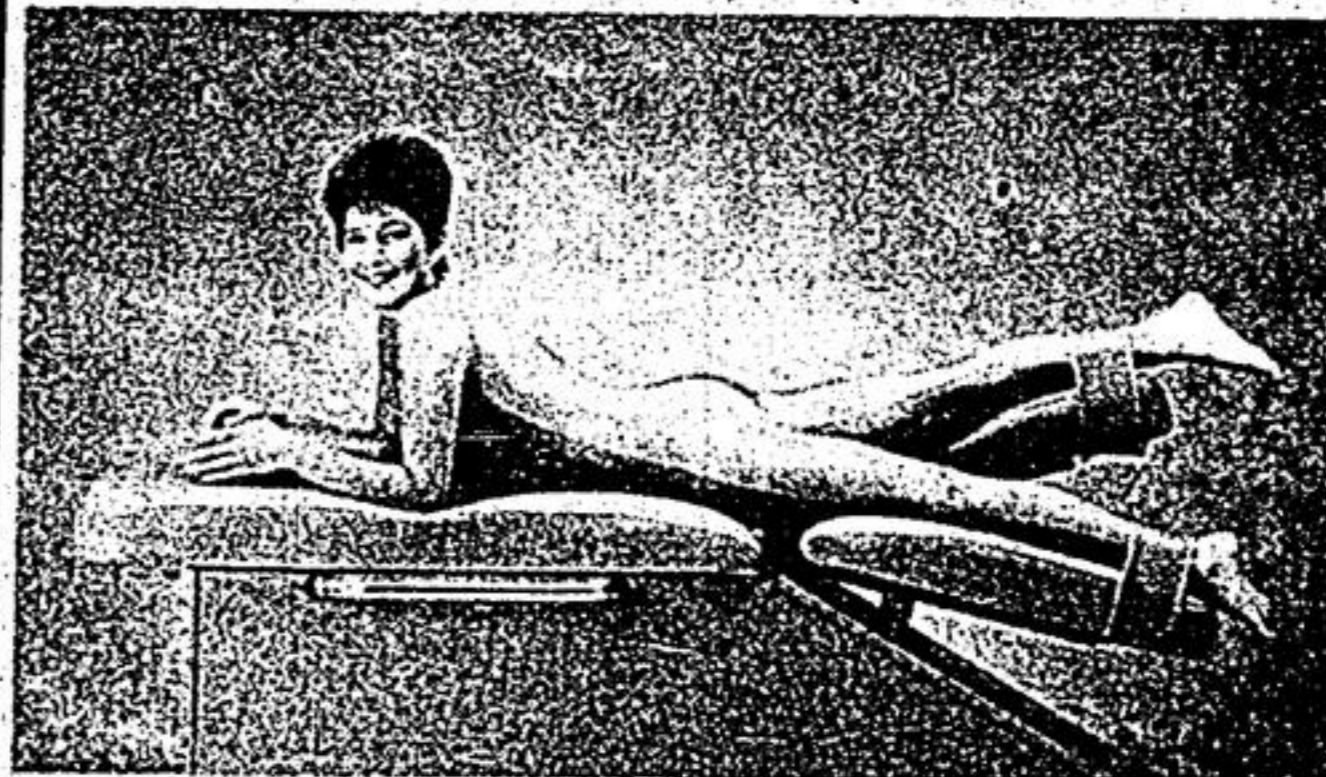
