16TH AVENUE CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT**

The Town of Markham is currently proceeding with Stage I, Class Environmental Assessment (CEA) for the widening of 16th Avenue from two to four lanes, between Kennedy Road and the Ninth Line and to construct the Markham by-pass between 16th Avenue and Highway 7. This review is being undertaken in accordance with the Class Environmental Assessment for the Municipal Road Project process.
