Future pondered at hydro meeting

A look to the future was offered by Whitchurch-Stouffville Hydro Commission Superintendent Brian Carter at Thursday's Hydro Commission meeting.

Based on a Town estimate of 1,750 new lots if additional sewage capacity becomes available, Mr. Carter felt such development would place a strain on the present hydro system.

"You're going to be on the borderline, so if something happens to one sub station you're in trouble in the future."

The report questioned whether Stouffville Hydro would be increased to take in the service area of Whitchurch. Tom Webb noted the Commission would have to find out whether it would be economically feasible to take it over, and whether the revenue taken in by the Commission would exceed the cost of restructuring.

The only other solution to meet increased hydro demands would be a separate sub station, commented Jim Sanders. Maureen Wideman noted one study put the cost of taking over the whole service area at close to \$3 million.

"If you don't do it now, there's no way you'll ever get it," stated Mr. Carter. A new study was being undertaken, he added.

Mr. Sanders said if the town needs more power, the commission would have to supply it.

"If the town is looking at expanding, there will be a significant amount of money needed just to do a feasibility study. Who will pay for that?" he queried.

He suggested the commission advise the Town of the situation in writing. Ontario Hydro will be having a planning meeting in Stouffville in April, advised Mr. Carter.

"I think a lot of information will come out during that meeting," stressed Mr. Webb. "I think the planning meeting will help us decide which way to go."

Mr. Sanders suggested the Commission should draft some terms of reference for a feasibility study on future needs. No date has yet been set for the Ontario Hydro Planning meeting, advised Mr. Carter.

Other items in his report included the need for an updated computer system within the next year or so; the urgent requirement for larger premises for the Commission and a complete mapping system with all outside records on computer.
