Mr. St. John was born on the Uxbridge Town Line on Oct. 27, 1909, and was a student at Stouffville High School. In 1939 he married Mary Crosier and took over the family farm from his father, William. He farmed there until around 1966, when he moved to Glad Park Avenue in Stouffville.

He started out in dairy farming, later becoming a market gardener. He loved to get involved in community activities and was a keen participant in both lawn bowling and alley bowling. He was a member of the Friendship Club and the Silver Jubilee Club and at one time worked as a volunteer with Meals on Wheels. He was a member of the congregation at Stouffville United Church.

An enthusiastic nature lover, Mr. St. John loved to fish both summer and winter when he would go ice fishing. He was also an avid bird watcher and built bird houses all around his property. He enjoyed working in his back yard and cultivated a beautiful and well-planned flower garden there.

The sudden loss of his wife in April, 1984, was a great blow to him, but with the help of his family and friends he continued to participate in community life until the last few weeks of his life, when he became seriously ill.

Mr. St. John leaves his son Gary of Stouffville, his daughter Diane Horvath of Ajax; great-grandchildren Stephanie, Samantha, Robin, Gary and Luke, and sister Velma Rawson of Stouffville.
