Mrs. Gertrude Kerswill Hundreds pay tribute to a very special lady

Stouffville United Church was filled to overflowing, Monday, March 27, as family and friends of Gertrude Kerswill gathered to mourn the loss of a very special lady.

Mrs. Kerswill was born Gertrude Winn, Nov. 7, 1919, on the Uxbridge-Pickering Townline. She spent much of her youth in Mongolia where she attended public school. Later, she was a student at Stouffville High, then located on the site of Summitview.

She was introduced to her husband, Charles, through a mutual friend when she was 19. They were married in 1945.

Mr. and Mrs. Kerswill spent their 44 years of married life on the family farm near Stouffville, where they raised six children, five boys and one girl.

Despite all the work a large family entailed, Mrs. Kerswill still found time to enroll in an income tax course with H and R Block. She not only handled the books for the family, but also provided a similar service for local farmers. She was a loyal member of the Altona Women's Institute for a period of 51 years. She was also a leader in 4-H.

Mrs. Kerswill loved to crochet and knit. She made dozens of beautiful doilies that she gave as wedding presents or gifts to relatives and friends. She was a perfectionist in her work. If she felt a piece wasn't right, she'd take it apart and begin again.

As a member in the congregation of Stouffville United Church, she taught Sunday School and served as a Girl Guide leader. In earlier years, she operated her own egg business, selling to customers in town.

Mrs. Kerswill had room in her heart and her home for everyone. Although she suffered from diabetes, she had been in reasonably good health. Her passing was unexpected.

"She loved the simple things of life," said daughter Marion, "like Sunday afternoon drives and visits and phone calls from the kids. These were the highlights of her life."

Mrs. Kerswill leaves her husband Charles; five sons — Lloyd, Stan, Lorne, Roy and Reginald;

one daughter Marion Jensen; a brother, Walter of Leaskdale; fifteen grandchildren and close friend Gerry Mitchell.

Rev. Wayne Reed and Rev. Herb Gale officiated at the service, March 27, in Stouffville.

Vote to retain name of Main St.

STOUFFVILLE — Did they win the battle and lose the war?

The B.I.A. (Business Improvement Area) board and the Chamber of Commerce are still contemplating the result.

Town Council is on record as requesting Stouffville's Main Street identity be retained.

It was initially anticipated the name Main Street would be replaced by Stouffville Road with the introduction of the '91 Emergency Call System.

The Region had been opposed

to duplication, it was said.

However, Town Planner Michael Saunders explained it was only a request and not a demand.

Council has recommended the section from Hwy. 48 to Hwy. 404 be known as Stouffville Road and Hwy. 48 to Durham Road 30 as Main Street.

New residential and business numbers must be altered, however, to conform with a grid that covers all of York, Council said.

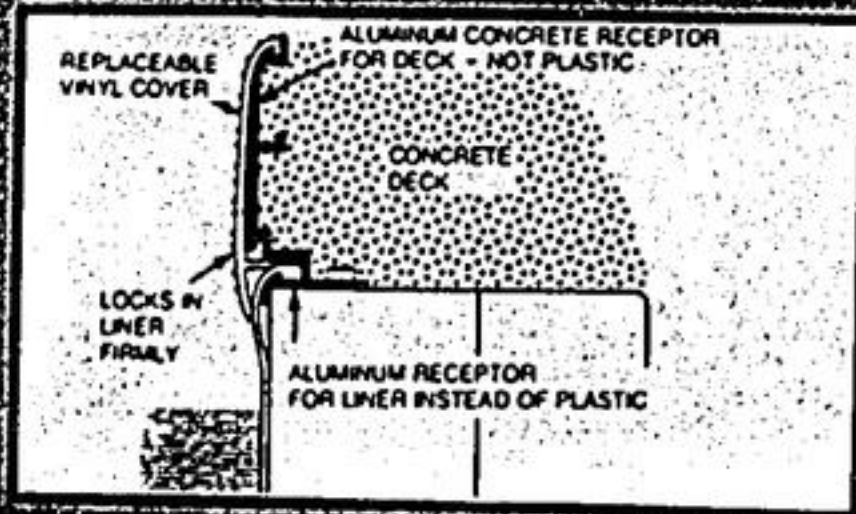
