

Community comes to the aid of Kurt Gengenbach



Lion still roaring after 40 years

MUSSELMAN'S LAKE - Vern Davies has been involved in Lionism over a period of four decades. His enthusiasm's just as strong today. "I joined the Stouffville Lions 40 years ago and remained there until the Ballantrae Club was formed," recalls the Musselman's Lake resident. "When I first joined, we met upstairs at Summitview School. The president then was high school principal Lou Murphy. Fellow Stouffville Lion Tom

Wood left at the same time as Vern to become the founding president at Ballantrae. Vern accepted the position of vice-president.

"During his Stouffville years, 'I did anything and everything,' he laughs. 'I was chairman of different things, but never president. I was president of the Ballantrae Lions; we've all had our stint here.'"

Vern also held the position of Guiding Lion during the inception of the Goodwood Club.

For Vern, Lionism is very satisfying.

"I really think I get more out of it than I put in - the fellowship, the enjoyment; we've been involved in so many different things."

Back in the '50s, the Lions subsidized the construction of tennis courts in Stouffville's Memorial Park. The Club was also involved in the operation of the town pool.

"For a long time, we handled the minor hockey and figure skating in Stouffville; we got it going," he says.

The Club's work in the community and involvement in assisting handicapped groups and individuals makes it all worthwhile, he notes.

"I love every part of the work we do. We try to do as much good as possible. There are clubs in almost every town across Canada and the United States."

Vern rejects the suggestion he's "a great Lion". He's just delighted, he says, to be part of the organization.

"I'm proud I've stuck with it 40 years. I've always been more of a follower than a leader. There have been some great leaders in the Club. I don't think I've done anything really special."

Vern's looking forward to continuing his involvement with the Ballantrae Lions for a long time to come.
