PUBLIC MEETING Proposed Zoning By-law Amendments TUESDAY, June 6, 1989, 7:30 p.m. COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MUNICIPAL OFFICES, BUTTONVILLE, ONTARIO 8911 Woodbine Avenue, Markham, Ontario

A Public Meeting will be held by the Planning Committee of the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham to consider proposed zoning by-law amendments under Section 34 of the Planning Act, 1983.

The proposed by-law amendments will amend By-laws 1767, 2150 and 2237. The designated areas of these by-laws are shown on the map below.

The purposes of the proposed by-law amendments are as follows:

1. To rescind By-laws 277-76, 276-76 and 279-76, which amend By-Laws 1767, 2150 and 2237 respectively.
2. To restrict permitted uses in single family residential zones to the following:
 - (a) single family detached dwellings
 - (b) schools under the jurisdiction of a Public School Board or a Separate School Board
 - (c) parks, playgrounds and other recreational areas under the control of a municipal or public authority.
3. To permit existing places of worship in residential zones subject to certain development requirements

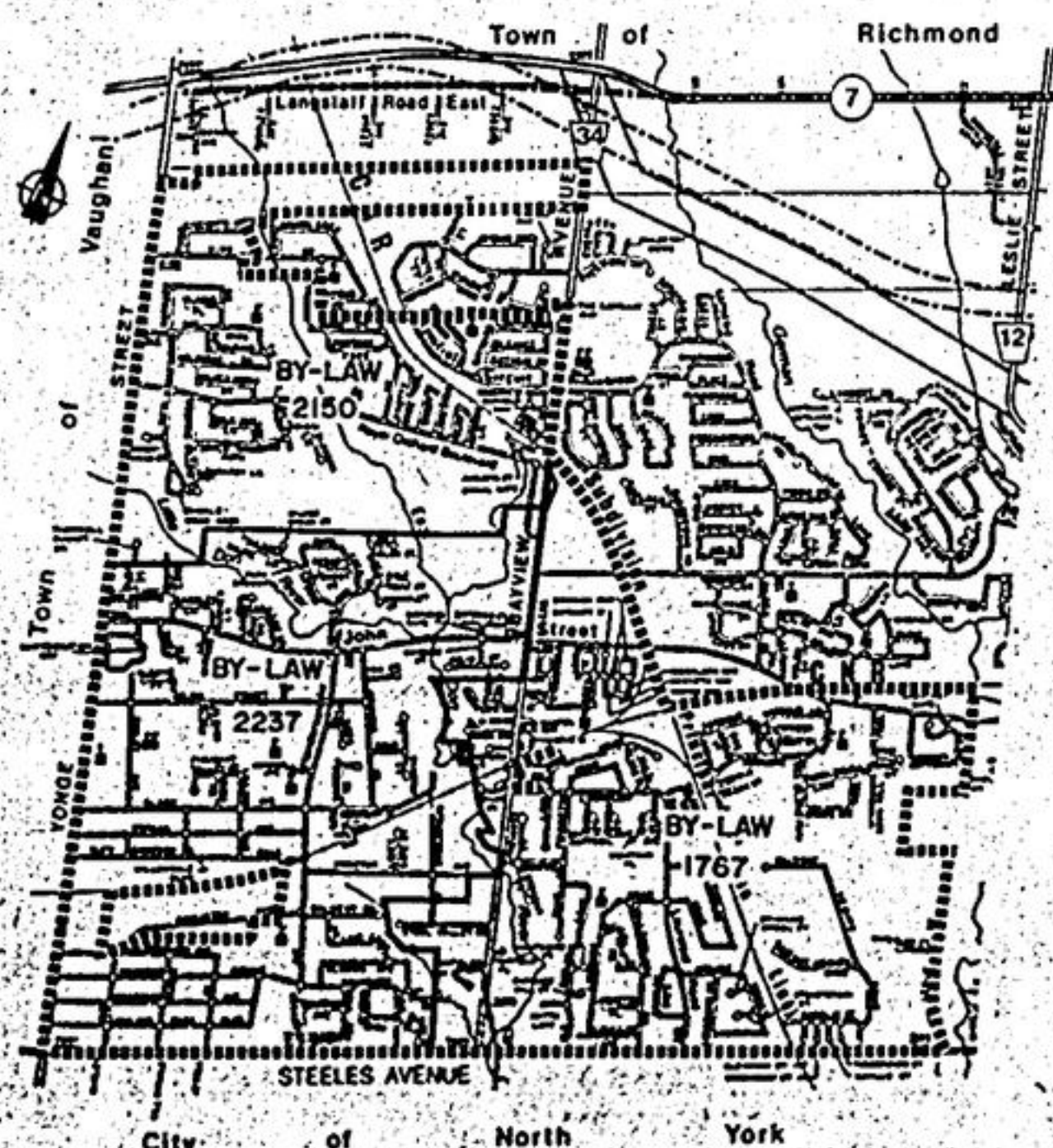
The effect of the proposed by-law amendments is to not permit new places of worship in single family residential zones. The amendment to By-law 1767 will additionally not permit agricultural use which is currently permitted.

The purpose of this meeting is to ensure that adequate information is made available to the public and to afford any person the opportunity to make representations in respect of the proposed zoning by-law amendments. If you are unable to attend the meeting, your representation can be filed in writing either by mail or personal delivery to reach the office of the Planning Director not later than June 6, 1989.

Additional information relating to the proposed zoning by-law amendments is available for inspection in the Planning Department, lower level, 8911 Woodbine Avenue between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday, or further information may be obtained by telephoning the Planning Department at 475-4861 during the same hours.
