

Approval to close Main St. still sought

Provincial approval to close Main St. from traffic on July 1 for the Strawberry Festival likely won't come until next month, officials from the Stouffville Business Improvement Area (BIA) heard at a recent meeting.

Stouffville BIA Chairman Sandra Stronach told

members at the meeting approval isn't expected until June 22 in reporting the progress of events for the annual Strawberry Festival.

Susan Berry advised members that, if such permission is granted, the Strawberry Festival Committee wanted to move events

they had organized for that Saturday afternoon from the park area to Main St. to avoid problems resulting from traffic being rerouted.

Ontario Premier David Peterson has been invited to officially open the Main St. area at 1 p.m.

100 years ago
 May 17, 1889: The citizens of Stouffville turned out en masse on Saturday night to listen to the sweet strains of music discoursed by our excellent Cornet Band. The crowd was not disappointed as the number of exceedingly good selections were rendered in a style which did great credit to the band and their popular leader Mr. N. Stouffer.

50 years ago
 May 19, 1939: Government surveyors have been in Stouffville and district the past two weeks working preparatory to issuing an official map of the recently-acquired highways from Stouffville to Uxbridge and Greenbank. The new map will indicate the location of every building, tree, post and stump within a radius of 33 feet either side from the centre of the highway.

25 years ago
 May 14, 1964: An assessment in-

crease of approximately \$650,000 in the Twp. of Uxbridge has resulted in a reduction in the general rate of 3.1 mills (farm and residential) and 3.5 mills (industrial and commercial). The rate will raise a total of \$49,640 as compared with \$17,199.38 in 1963.

10 years ago
 May 17, 1979: The trade fair's been cancelled. Legion president Ivan Goudie announced the decision following a committee meeting Monday night. Insufficient response on the part of exhibitors was given as the reason.

With two weeks to go, only 20 spaces had been reserved inside the arena and two outside, president Goudie said. Payment had been received for only eight.
