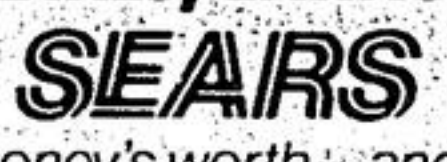

While those who decide that type of thing at the professional level were trying to decide which pro hockey star was 'Most Valuable,' either Wayne Gretzky or Mario Lemieux, the physical education department at Stouffville District Secondary School had their own dilemma to contend with.

Scott, whose presence as the team's premier pitcher was considered overkill earlier in the season, when the Spartans were virtually unchallenged in league play, fired a no hitter to put his team in the semi-finals for the regional crown, then shut out Sacred Heart 4-0 on one hit to put his team in the final.
He allowed only one hit in the Spartans tough 1-0 title loss to Huron Heights Friday.

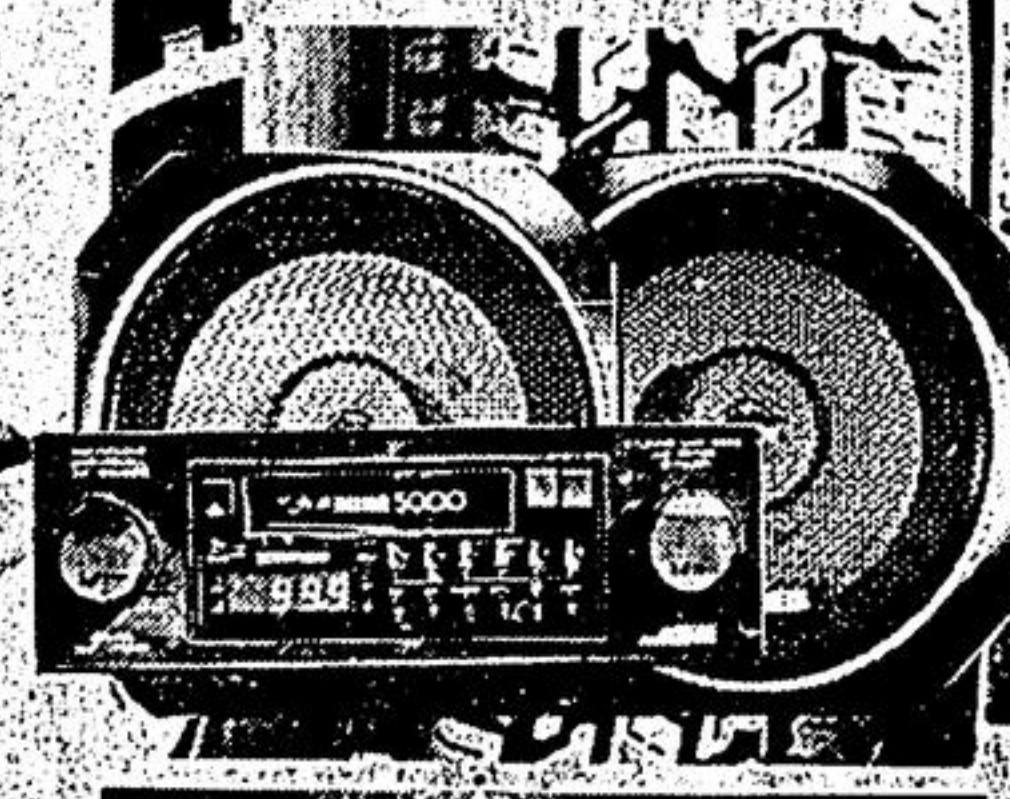

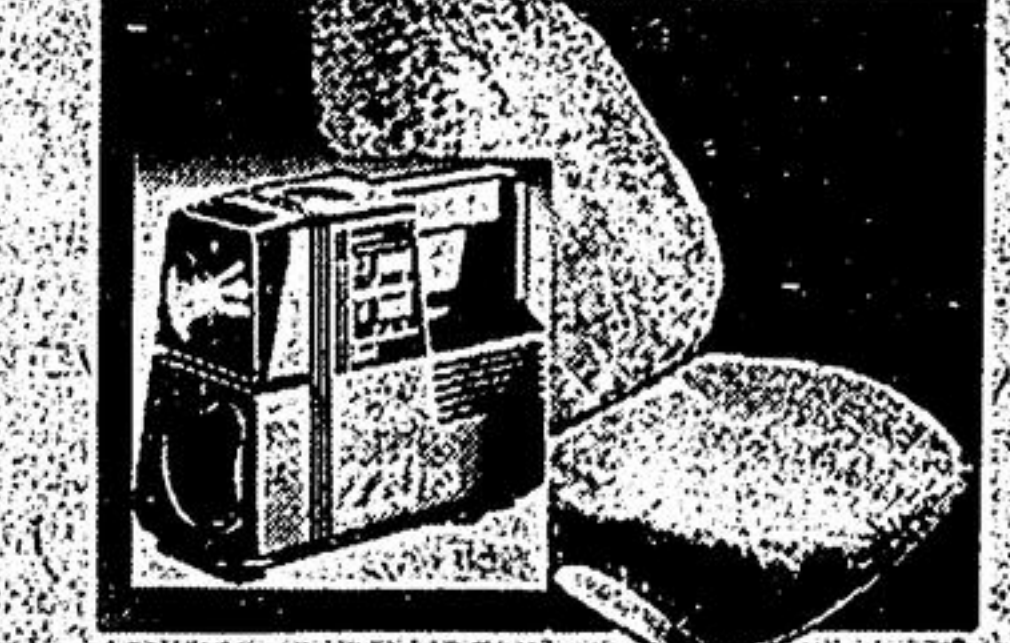
